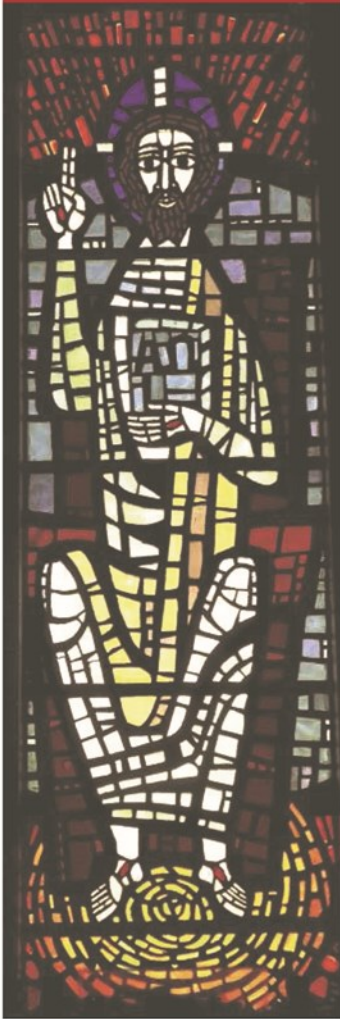

THE POWER OF WORDS

We all know that words can be powerful and how they affect you emotionally and mentally in what you say or hear. Joyful words, painful words, consoling words, hurtful words, words of praise, or words of judgment can reveal our moods as well as our sentiment toward another person. Words become a reflection of our inner self and reveal a truth about us... which can be a blessing or a curse. Therefore, remember to "choose your words carefully..." implying the power and accountability in what is said or heard.

Today, we celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God. The Bible... a powerful gift that God bestowed upon us. Knowing that these words and passages were so carefully inspired by the Holy Spirit can have such a profound impact on us as they are proclaimed and heard. I am always reminded that the Word of God is alive... the message we hear from the same scripture can have an intense effect on us depending on circumstances in our lives. God's Word is not intended to be just heard but to be felt, lived, and resonated throughout the world.

So I encourage you to take time to open your bible (or "app") to listen to the Word and reflect on what God so lovingly has to tell us.

The following are excerpts from... Apostolic Letter Issued "Motu Proprio" By The Supreme Pontiff Francis "Aperuit Illis" Instituting The Sunday Of The Word Of God... Pope Francis announced that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time would be celebrated as the Sunday of the Word of God. (P3) ...and devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the word of God. We are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity. This is more than a temporal coincidence: [that this] celebration... has ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, [it is] the path to authentic and firm unity. (P5)

The relationship between the Risen Lord, the community of believers, and sacred Scripture is essential to our identity as Christians. Without the Lord who opens our minds to them, it is impossible to understand the Scriptures in depth. Yet the contrary is equally true: without the Scriptures, the events of the mission of Jesus and of his Church in this world would remain incomprehensible. (P5)

In the hearing of God's word, the Church is built up and grows... God in turn makes use of the congregation of the faithful that celebrates the Liturgy in order that His word may speed on and be glorified and that His name be exalted among the nations. (P3)

The word of God proclaimed in the celebration of God's mysteries does not only address present conditions but looks back to past events and forward to what is yet to come. Thus God's word shows us what we should hope for with such a longing that in this changing world our hearts will be set on the place where our true joys lie (Preamble, 7). (P3)

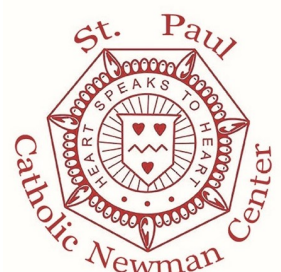
My favorite scripture passage comes from Luke while the disciples were on the Road to Emmaus, "Were not our hearts burning [within us] while he, [referring to Jesus], spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us?"

My hopes are that your hearts will "burn with desire" from the Word of God.

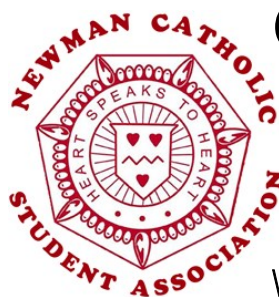

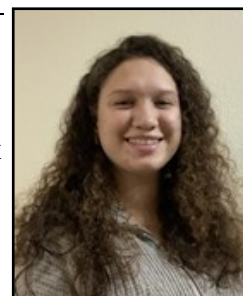
FRESNO PACIFIC

Today we see the blueprint of Jesus' mission: "proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and curing every disease among the people." (Matthew 4:12-23).

By proclaiming the Gospel of the Kingdom, Jesus is sharing the mystery, the promise and whatever gives us access to the Kingdom of God. And, by curing *every* disease, Jesus is affirming that He had the power to proclaim what He proclaims.

Yet, we have to not only accept this but to actually make room for it in our lives. "Repent" says Jesus; in other words, He is asking us to revise our lives, to rearrange the heart and to make room for the Gospel within us.

Ask God for the grace to do this. I'll give you here a prayer St. Anthony Claret would pray every day to repent, believe in the Gospel and help spreading it:

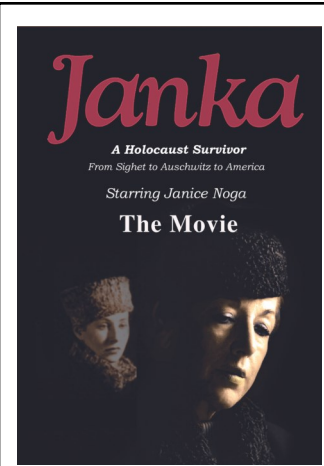

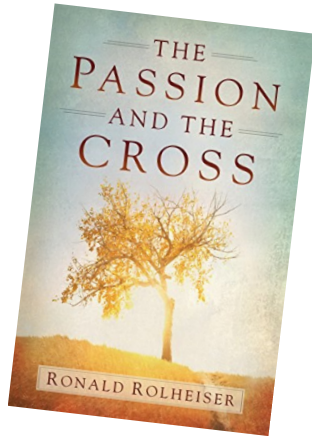

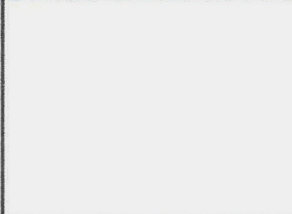
