FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

YEAR A | JANUARY 29, 2023

The words of this weekend's readings may strike a familiar note. God's justice is seen through the living testimony of his people. First, the faithful remnant of Israel testified to God's triumph after generations of war, exile, and political turmoil. Then, as the Good News of Jesus revealed God's work among all peoples, the humble sufferings of a few "weak and despised" believers sheds light on the folly of the world's wisdom. The famous words of Jesus in the Beatitudes encapsulate unique dimensions of this testimony with each phrase. Christ's Reign does not only depend on individual behavior to liberate a world captive to sin, but a power that reaches to the heavens, making peace, spreading mercy, and even restoring a right relationship to the land.

I cannot help but imagine what Jesus' words might affect here in our Central Valley. There are certainly the "meek" among us who still wait for their inheritance. One may immediately think of the migrant and farm laborers whose lives are affected by increasingly extreme weather. As I have written before on this page, I see more and more people encamping along the aqueducts and overpasses because housing is so scarce, even in our "affordable" city. But there are other issues of land at stake in our vicinity. Some of you

may have heard about a group of local indigenous people who fought for several years to rename their ancestral homeland, which was named with what many Natives consider to be a racial slur. This town, just east of us on state highway 180, is now renamed "Yokuts Valley," and continues to be a topic of debate among residents. Because California Natives are consistently among the most disenfranchised and underrepresented groups in our midst, we may not realize that cases like this provide us with an opportunity to stand in solidarity with those who continue to suffer very real injustice. The work is not over: the Choinumni Yokuts still fight for tribal rights since their historical treaties were broken long ago in the 19th century.

Gustavo Gutierrez writes that the suffering of the poor and oppressed has implications on the entire faith of the Church: "If we love others, then we love them in their social context. This requirement makes commitment more demanding but also more authentic [...] as John Paul II has said, solidarity is a proof of the fidelity of the church to its Lord." When we engage in this kind of work, we find a true conversion of heart, we find that our heart has space for the good that it did not previously hold. Speaking with words that should resonate with all of us, Pope Francis preached in a homily (while Archbishop of Buenos Aires) that "Blessed are you who do good and many times are misunderstood and criticized, but do not lower your embrace for hope [...] Jesus calls blessed those who allow their hearts to be opened and enlarged by the things that happen to them."


May we all walk in the light of God's saving grace, which invites us to a profound conversion of heart that gives us new eyes to see the Reign of God arising all around us.

My eye doctor told me I needed new glasses. Without them, I see things blurry. The glasses actually help me see better; they actually help me see!

This weekend Jesus is inviting us to see life through a rather unique pair of glasses: the Beatitudes. This pair of glasses can help us see better, so when we mourn, hunger for righteousness or suffer persecution come, we can see clearly that is not all there is to life.

Only God knows what happens behind closed doors and all the pains and sufferings that we may be going through. Sometimes those things can make our life blurry. Yet, God is always at work sending you pairs of glasses so you can always see light amidst darkness.

The *raison d'être* of the Beatitudes is God's immortal covenant that God made with you on your Baptism: in the Gospel today we read: "When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him.

He began to teach them" (Matthew 5:1-12). Jesus will always see you with a 20/20 vision and will climb all mountains to find you, and He will give you a pair of glasses (teach you) to help you see and see better!


