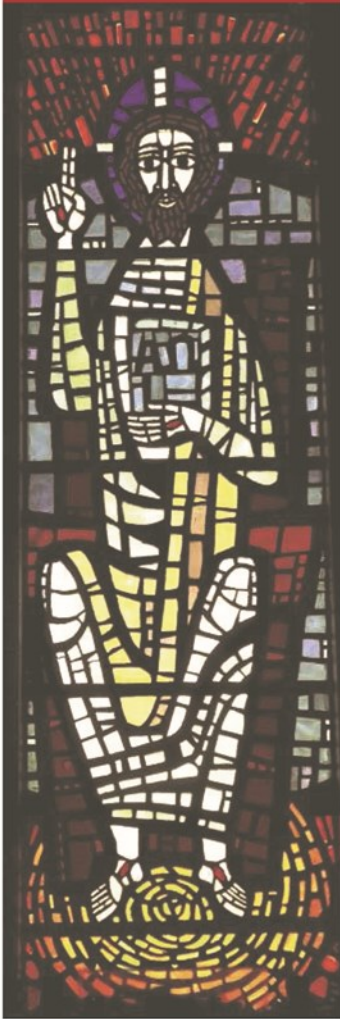

THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

In last week's gospel Jesus called us "Blessed" in the Beatitudes. This week He uses two very biblical metaphors or symbols to tell us what we are as Christians. He tells us, "You are the salt of the earth. You are the light of the world."

We are well acquainted with the symbol of light – from the lighting of the candle as a part of the baptismal ritual right through to the paschal candle that is lit in the darkness of the Easter Vigil liturgy. From our baptism on, we are always light. It is in and through us and our whole way of life that others are enlightened and come to see and understand that God is a good God who wants only the good things in life for all of us here on earth. We are called – commissioned – as Christians to shine forth and respond to the needs of our fellow human beings. We are to reflect and conduct God's light to others. Why hide it? It's meant to shine so that others see that God is the real source of human goodness and happiness.

Salt is not something that we readily associate as being a Christian symbol. This is quite striking statement if you really think about it for a moment. We as Christians, not because as individuals we might have lively and vivacious personalities, but as Christians, all of us, do for people what salt does for food. We show each other that life here in this world is tasty and full of zest; that life is not a valley of tears just to be suffered through on our way to heaven, but that life is to be lived with vim and vigor and spice and liveliness.

Life with all its reality is engaging and exciting. Christians, because of our faith, are alive and enthusiastic, stirring up people to live – live it to the fullest because even with all its difficulties and sufferings it is so wonderfully worthwhile.

It sounds like being salt and light is the job description of the Christian. The prophet Isaiah tells us very specifically and very concretely, "Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own."

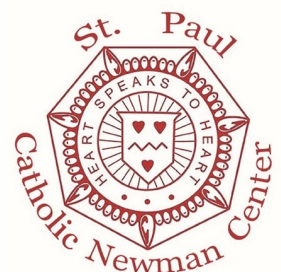
As commodities, necessary for life and well-being, salt and light lend themselves as symbols of discipleship. Jesus' followers were called and are still called to be persons whose lives illuminate, guide, and reflect the goodness of Christ, who is The Light of the World. So also are Christians to impart passion, flavor, purity, and permanence to their relationship with one another and with God. To be salt and light is to make it a daily possibility for others to taste and see the goodness of the Lord.

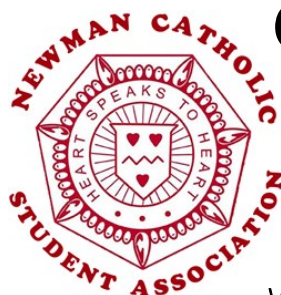

Thank You

Thank you to those who supported Catholic Charities throughout the 2022 year. Every day we see lines of families standing in the cold waiting to be served. We are committed to never sending any person away empty handed, without much needed food to nourish their bodies or any of the other essential services offered. This past year alone, Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Fresno served more than 275,000 clients – a 64% increase over the number served just three years ago. In addition to emergency food assistance through our Food Pantry:

- We distributed more than 540,000 lbs. of food in the rural communities of our Diocese through 112 individual and unique outreach events
- We distributed more than 91,000 units of clothing
- We provided emergency rental and mortgage assistance to over 700 families who were at risk of becoming homeless while in between jobs
- We offered nearly 2,000 individuals the help getting signed up on Cal Fresh (food stamps) to help families better prepare for large grocery store bills
- We helped over 500 families sign up on Medi-Cal who previously had no access to health insurance
- We distributed over 230,000 diapers to children ages 0-5
- We assisted more than 600 people with various types of immigration cases including US Citizenship
- We offered disaster preparedness and education to underserved communities
- We provided disaster case management services to survivors of three different California wildfires in Fresno County, Tulare County and Mariposa County as families looked to rebuild

“Parishes are not a club for the few, which give a certain kind of social belonging.” This is Francis’ vision for parishes, which he explains in his February video, produced by the Pope’s Worldwide Prayer Network. It’s not a new vision, but rather the same that Christianity has had since its origins. The Pope tells us that parishes “have to become once again schools of service and generosity, with their doors always open to those who are excluded. And to those included. To all.” They must be “close-knit communities, without bureaucracy, people-centered.” And he ends his message asking us to “be daring” to make parishes be this way again.

“Sometimes I think that we should put a sign on the door of parishes that says, “Free admission.”

Parishes should be close-knit communities, without bureaucracy, people-centered — a place where the gift of the sacraments can be found.

They have to become once again schools of service and generosity, with their doors always open to those who are excluded. And to those included. To all.

Parishes are not a club for the few, which give a certain kind of social belonging.

Please, let us be daring.

Let us all rethink the style of our parochial communities.

Let us pray that parishes, placing communion – communion of people, ecclesial communion– at the center, may increasingly become communities of faith, of fraternity and of welcoming the most in need”.

REFLECTING BACK ONE YEAR

One year ago on February 23, 2022, Pope Francis addressed the General Audience in Paul VI Audience Hall to make his appeal on the situation in Ukraine. Here is an excerpt of that message:

My heart aches greatly at the worsening situation in Ukraine. Despite the diplomatic efforts of the last few weeks, increasingly alarming scenarios are opening up. Like me, many people all over the world are feeling anguish and concern. Once again the peace of all is threatened by partisan interests. I would like to appeal to those with political responsibility to examine their consciences seriously before God, who is the God of peace and not of war; who is the Father of all, not just of some, who wants us to be brothers and not enemies. I pray that all the parties involved refrain from any action that would cause even more suffering to the people, destabilizing coexistence between nations and bringing international law into disrepute.

And now I would like to appeal to everyone, believers and non-believers alike. Jesus taught us that the diabolical senselessness of violence is answered with God's weapons, with prayer and fasting. I invite everyone to make next 2 March, Ash Wednesday, a Day of Fasting for Peace. I encourage believers in a special way to dedicate themselves intensely to prayer and fasting on that day. May the Queen of Peace preserve the world from the madness of war.

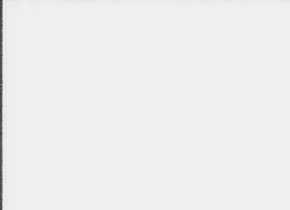
