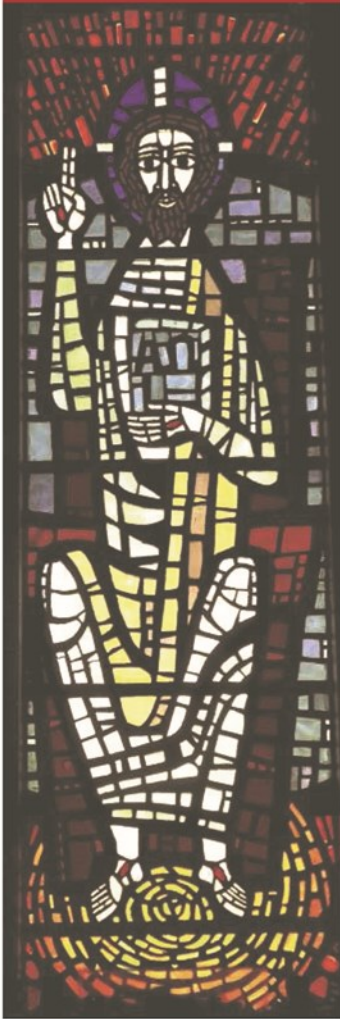

GOD'S CALL TO THE EREMITIC LIFE

When we think of a hermit, we often imagine someone living in a cave, or in a hut in the depths of a forest miles from civilization, never seeing or talking to anyone. Or we think of medieval anchorites and anchoresses such as Julian of Norwich, who were literally walled-up in a small cell attached a church, but this ancient calling from God is alive and well in our modern times.

Today's hermits could not be more different from those of antiquity. While some belong to a religious community such as the Camaldolese or Carmelites, throughout the world there are lay men and women who answer God's call to the contemplative life while living in their own homes, often in the center of a busy city, and have active ministries in their church communities. Many have part-time jobs in order to support themselves. Many are artists, writers, or creators of beautiful woodwork or crafts, but the most important part of their daily life is to draw closer to God in a life of prayer, especially intercessory prayer for the world, for the sick - for us all. Each has a Rule of Life particular to his or her own situation.

The call from God to a life of prayer and solitude often comes later in life, especially for women. Their children have grown, or a beloved spouse has died. They are too old to be nuns, and becoming a hermit allows them to be part of the religious life. Canon 603 of the Catholic Church has recognized this calling both for men and women.

Mary Fotheringham, whom many of you will recognize as a lector and member of the RCIA Team, has been discerning a call to the eremitic life for several years. We hope that you will join us for a special Mass at 7:00pm on Thursday, March 2 at the Newman Center, where Mary will be consecrated as a diocesan hermit by Bishop Joseph Brennan.

Can. 603 § 1. In addition to institutes of consecrated life, the Church recognizes the eremitic or anchoritic life by which the Christian faithful devote their life to the praise of God and the salvation of the world through a stricter withdrawal from the world, the silence of solitude, and assiduous prayer and penance.

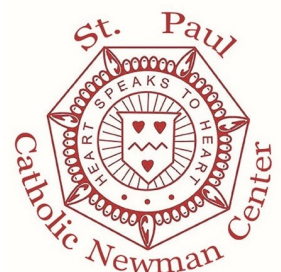
§ 2. A hermit is recognized by law as one dedicated to God in consecrated life if he or she publicly professes in the hands of the diocesan bishop the three evangelical counsels, confirmed by vow or other sacred bond, and observes a proper program of living under his direction.

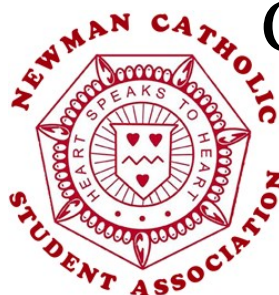

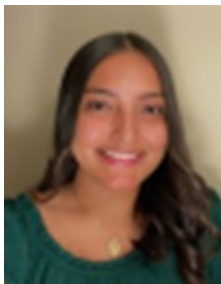

COLLECTION FOR THE CHURCH IN CENTRAL AND EASTERN EUROPE

On February 24, Russia initiated military action against Ukraine with attacks throughout the country, including in the capital city, Kyiv. Major Archbishop of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church in Kyiv, Sviatoslav Shevchuk, addresses the faithful in Ukraine and around the world in this video. In his appeal for prayers for the peace and safety of the Ukrainian people, he reminds us to place hope in Christ, that “after night, there comes day... After darkness, there comes light, just as after death there comes resurrection.”

The Church in Ukraine is helping to share and foster this hope even amidst this violence. Though curfews keep the faithful from gathering in churches, “the Church will come to the people” by continuing to celebrate liturgy and provide the Sacraments in bomb shelters and underground stations.

Pope Francis has called upon the Universal Church to pray and fast especially for peace in

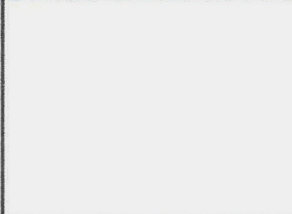
