

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

YEAR A | FEBRUARY 26, 2023

The portion of the story of Creation that we hear in today's first reading offers a primordial account of sin, one that explains to God's people Israel just how their predicament came to be. As a testimony against the foreign gods of Babylon that sent them into captivity, Israel understands itself in humility instead of arrogance. Adam and Eve are separate from the knowledge of good and evil, which up to this point is tended and cared for by God alone. By contrast, the gods of Babylon create humankind out of the broken pieces of other slain gods, and the heroic human Gilgamesh triumphs over both hell and heaven. To me, this is a necessary reminder that chaos is sometimes more apparent than goodness, and that the ways that we pursue order and completion often go against what God has already planted in our most intrinsic being. Rather than struggling against the gods and forces of heaven, Adam and Eve must choose whether or not to trust God's provision for them. In the language of story and deep oral tradition, Israel understands itself as suffering the consequences of self-sufficiency.

As we enter this Lenten season together, perhaps we may ask God how we can depend more on him in specific ways. For many of us, this will dovetail with a practice of fasting or other penance. For some of us, we will embrace a positive action each day to bring us more in line with the good that God shows us. One friend gives us coffee; another goes to the gym every day. St. Paul tells us that we, who are all in the same boat when it comes to our inability to save ourselves, are liberated by the actions of one person, Jesus. The letter to Romans helps us think about the difficult question of how Christ is both human and divine, and how important it is that He is both! The very human sin of Adam is more than made up by the very human obedience and sufferings of Jesus. We are invited to relate to Jesus as both our human brother and our divine savior who conquers the consequences of the deep past and painful present that lingers around all of us.

Before the ashes are washed from our faces on Wednesday, many of us were probably frustrated by a particular situation at work, something we see on the news, or maybe a conversation with a family member. Some of us carry deep grief and struggle to find the crack of light that we had hoped for in this season. We felt the burden of our inability to fix everything. Our flesh bears many such burdens, but we need not bear those alone. Our Lenten practice helps us to turn away from the things that trip us up and focus on the mystery of love that is being nurtured into new life each day in Christ. As Pope St. Gregory the Great says, "be not anxious about what you have, but about what you are."

And it all comes down to this: the Devil can and will tempt us all He wants, but he could never make us! That's what Jesus is teaching us this weekend. Freedom is the most beautiful gift God has given us; and God stands by that gift. Jesus, as a human man, was in the desert for 40 days, hungry, cold and lonely: such a state of vulnerability. Still, the Devil could not make him fall. If even God respects our freedom, such a limited being as the Devil could never (and will never) get in there!!!




