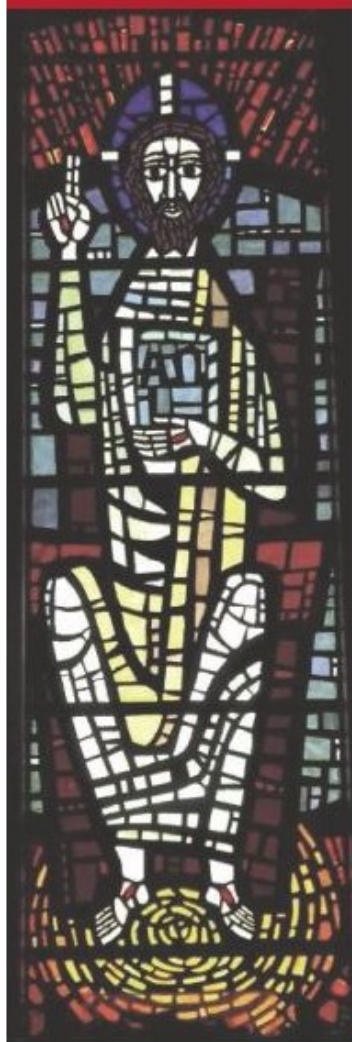

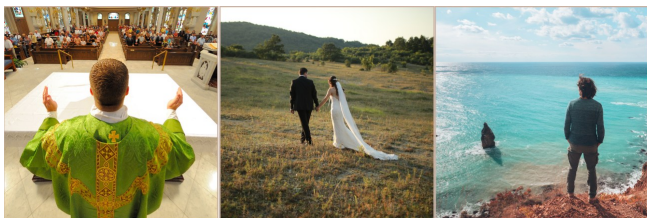

ST. ANTHONY MARY CLARET BIOGRAPHY

Saint Anthony Mary Claret (1807–1870) was a Spanish missionary and reformer who founded the congregation of the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, also known as the Claretians. Born into a family of weavers, he became a Catholic priest and later served as the Archbishop of Santiago de Cuba and as the confessor to Queen Isabella II of Spain. Throughout his life, he was a prolific preacher and writer, overcoming numerous attempts on his life and facing political turmoil.

Early life and missionary work

- Birth and early career: Born Antoni Maria Claret i Clarà in Sallent, Spain, on December 23, 1807, he worked as a weaver with his family before entering the seminary at the age of 22.
- Missionary in Spain: After his ordination in 1835, Claret's passion for missionary work led him to preach extensively in his home region of Catalonia and the Canary Islands. He was a powerful orator, known for drawing large crowds and for his long hours in the confessional.
- Founding the Claretians: After a failed attempt to join the Jesuits due to ill health, he returned to Spain and founded the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in 1849. He also established the Religious Publishing House in Barcelona to distribute Catholic books and pamphlets.

Archbishop in Cuba

- Appointment in Cuba: In 1850, Pope Pius IX appointed Claret the Archbishop of Santiago de Cuba, a post he initially resisted.
- Reforms and challenges: For six years, Claret worked tirelessly to revitalize the church in Cuba. He focused on reforming the clergy, establishing schools and technical colleges, and promoting agricultural self-sufficiency among the poor. His reforms and moral stance, particularly against social injustices like slavery, earned him powerful enemies.
- Attempts on his life: Claret endured numerous assassination attempts while in Cuba, including a serious attack in the city of Holguín, where he was wounded with a knife. He notably forgave his attacker.

Confessor to the queen and exile

- Return to Spain: In 1857, Queen Isabella II recalled Claret to Spain to serve as her confessor.

- Ministry in Madrid: Claret continued his apostolic work while at court, publishing hundreds of books and pamphlets and founding the Academy of St. Michael, which brought together artists and writers to promote Catholic culture. He also oversaw the restoration of the El Escorial monastery, establishing a university there.
- Exile: When revolution broke out in Spain in 1868, Claret was forced into exile with the royal family. He later traveled to Rome to participate in the First Vatican Council, where he was a staunch defender of papal infallibility.

Final years and canonization

- Death in France: Suffering from ill health and pursued by his enemies even in exile, Claret eventually retired to a Cistercian monastery in France, where he died on October 24, 1870.
- Canonization: Pope Pius XI beatified him in 1934, and Pope Pius XII canonized him in 1950. He is the patron saint of weavers and the Catholic press.

ST. ANTHONY MARY CLARET TRIDUUM

The Triduum and Feast Day of St. Anthony Mary Claret -
Evening Masses October 22, 23, 24

In this weekend's bulletin you will find the biography of St. Anthony Mary Claret, founder and patron of the Claretian Missionaries. At St. Paul Catholic Newman Center we are blessed with two full-time Claretian Missionaries, Fr. Rubi and Fr. David. In honor of St. Anthony's Feast Day, we will be celebrating a Triduum and his feast day with evening Masses on Wednesday - Friday, October 22-24. Mass will take place at 6:00 p.m. on each of these evenings. On Friday evening we will follow up with light refreshments in the Community Room immediately following Mass.
