Dear Friends and Parishioners,

We hope you are all enjoying the cool weather these days! As we enter the month of Thanksgiving, we also celebrate Restorative Justice in November. Restorative Justice is a different approach in seeking responsibility and accountability for the harm done where the focus is all about restoring the brokenness amongst all parties involved - the offender, the victim, and the community. Knowingly or not, we are all affected directly or indirectly by everyone and everything happening in our community. Restorative Justice serves both the offenders and the victims. Unfortunately, the available support for the victims' are limited, if there is any. The pain and suffering of the victims are both deep and long-lasting. The need for emotional and spiritual support for the victims are huge!! It is comforting for them to feel that they are not alone as they go through the journey of healing from the horrible experiences of homicide, domestic violence, sexual assault, early childhood abuse, intimate partner violence, or any type of crime where their sense of dignity, safety, and hope was aggressively taken away from them. We, the Crime Survivors Ministry, are committed to serving this need and we would like to invite each one of you to please come join us in this service.

In 2012, John Christopher Godburn was called by the Holy Spirit to start a new ministry. His "YES" to this calling had led to the beginning of the Crime Survivors Ministry. The

Lord works in mysterious ways and unfortunately, the opportunity came after his passing. In 2019, I attended a three-day training offered by Debbie McDermott, Associate Director Restorative Justice at California Catholic Conference. With the blessing of Jim Grant, who at that time was the Restorative Justice Director of the diocese, I started the Crime Survivors Ministry to honor the legacy of my late husband John. In February 2021, Bishop Brennan gave his blessing for me to continue with the ministry after Jim Grant had retired.

Together, let us all be united with our brothers and sisters who are hurting from the violence happening in our society today.

To help the victims in their healing journey, we offer them a safe space to freely process their thoughts and feelings, such as healing retreats, healing circles, companioning, prayer service at the crime site, and other trauma-informed care. The ministry envisions that we all become instruments of peace, light, and hope. We aspire to bring awareness of the innate relatedness amongst us and be bound by the love and mercy of God. Together, let us all be united with our brothers and sisters who are hurting from the violence happening in our society today. May your heart be open to the silent whispers of the Holy Spirit as you give your 'yes' to His calling to serve this population with great love.
