THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C | NOVEMBER 13, 2022

Do you have a favorite verse or passage from Scripture? Many of us can quote John 3:16, one of St. Paul's exhortations (maybe Philippians 4:13: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me"), or even a classic word from the Prophets (like Jeremiah 29:11: For I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord..."). Personally, it's hard for me to choose one, although you'd think since I studied the Bible as a graduate student I would have a short list. When I'm presented with the Word of God this weekend, however, I hear some words that have become fast favorites and have committed themselves easily to memory. They come from Malachi, who, as a biblical prophet, is more known for closing out the pages of the Old Testament with the words "utter destruction" (yikes) than with any kind of wholesome lasting message. Thanks to the lectionary, we hear words that I feel are among the most powerful images in Scripture:

But for you who fear my name, the sun of justice will arise with healing in its wings.

The imagery is one of a renewed world. The rays of the sun sweep out to the earth's edges like wings that promise healing and hope for the cosmos, which surely was a message that Israel needed to hear in its time of exile and tribulation. Bible scholars think that the Prophet here intentionally borrows

language from the surrounding Near Eastern societies that would have contrasted, contested, and ultimately helped shape Israel's identity as a people set apart. If you keep reading from that same portion of Malachi, you'll come upon another amazing piece of imagery:

And you will go out leaping like calves from the stall and tread down the wicked; They will become dust under the soles of your feet, on the day when I take action, says the LORD of hosts.

Now, I didn't believe that cattle actually leap from the stall until somebody showed me a YouTube video of this happening. To me, this sheds new light on the idea of destruction that we hear of in the Hebrew Bible and elsewhere. The generative action of releasing calves from the stall into a new pasture is paired with God's judgment on the wicked. It's not Godzilla shooting his radiation breath over Tokyo, or the pestilence of Camus' Plague unleashed on an Algerian city. We simply see livestock stretching enthusiastically for their new home out of the stall. We don't need to read this stuff that symbolically. Jesus tells the people that, even should the very worst happen, God is working to bring that world of life-giving justice to fruition.

P.S., I have to admit that one of the ways I memorized this passage was by listening to the song "But For You Who Fear My Name" by The Welcome Wagon. The group is a husband-and-wife duo who recorded the music at their church in Brooklyn, New York. If you enjoy the indie-folk aesthetics of banjos, tambourines, and hand-clapping, do give it a listen!


