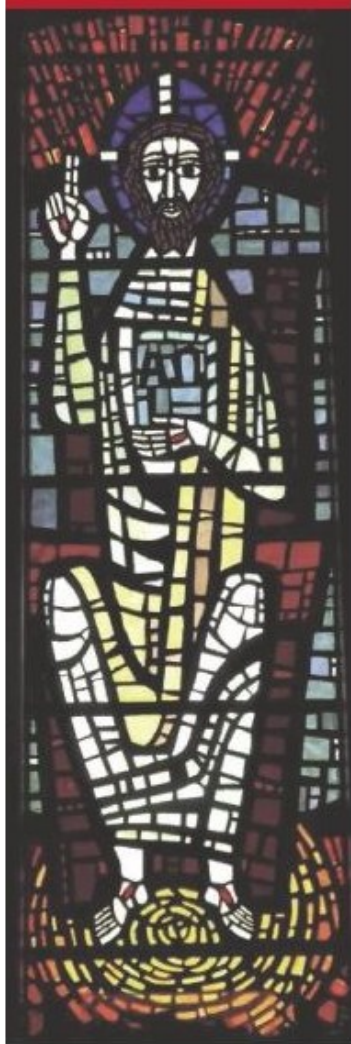

FR. SERGIO NEGRO SCHOLARSHIP

Applications Now Available

Applications for the Sergio P Negro Scholarship for the 2026-2027 academic year are now available on the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center website. The Sergio P Negro Endowment Fund was established in honor of our founding priest, Sergio Negro, who had a deep and abiding commitment to education. The Endowment Fund anticipates awarding a minimum of three, \$3,000 scholarships to deserving students for the academic year.

To be eligible, you must be enrolled at a regionally or nationally accredited college or university and must be pursuing a course of study that leads to a vocational/technical certificate, or an undergraduate or graduate degree in preparation to use your knowledge and skills to witness and minister to others. This is meant to be inclusive of many vocations and forms of service, including education, engineering, medicine, social services, etc. A pre-condition is that you must have either been raised within or are currently affiliated and active with our St. Paul Catholic Newman Center university parish, beyond attending Mass. An overall GPA of 2.5 or greater is also required.

Past recipients who are continuing their education/training are welcome to re-apply.

The deadline for applications to be received is Sunday, April 12, 2026 by 5:00 pm, PDT. They may be submitted electronically to

SergioNegroScholarship@fresnewmancenter.org or mailed to Sergio P Negro Scholarship, c/o St. Paul Catholic Newman Center, 1572 E. Barstow Ave., Fresno, CA 93710. In all cases, applications and accompanying documents must be typed. Final selection of awardees will be through an interview process.

DID YOU KNOW



In the final Lent of his papacy in 2025, Pope Francis called us to conversion, urging us to show sympathy and compassion towards migrants, recognizing that we all are pilgrims in this life:

“It is hard to think of the biblical exodus without also thinking of those of our brothers and sisters who in our own day are fleeing situations of **misery and violence** in search of a better life for themselves and their loved ones. A first call to **conversion** thus comes from the realization that all of us are pilgrims in this life; each of us is invited to stop and ask how our lives reflect this fact. Am I really on a journey, or am I standing still, not moving, either immobilized by fear and hopelessness or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone? Am I seeking ways to leave behind the occasions of sin and situations that degrade my dignity? It would be a good Lenten exercise for us to compare our daily life with that of some migrant or foreigner, to learn how to **sympathize** with their experiences and in this way discover what God is asking of us so that we can better **advance on our journey** to the house of the Father. This would be a good ‘examination of conscience’ for all of us wayfarers.”
