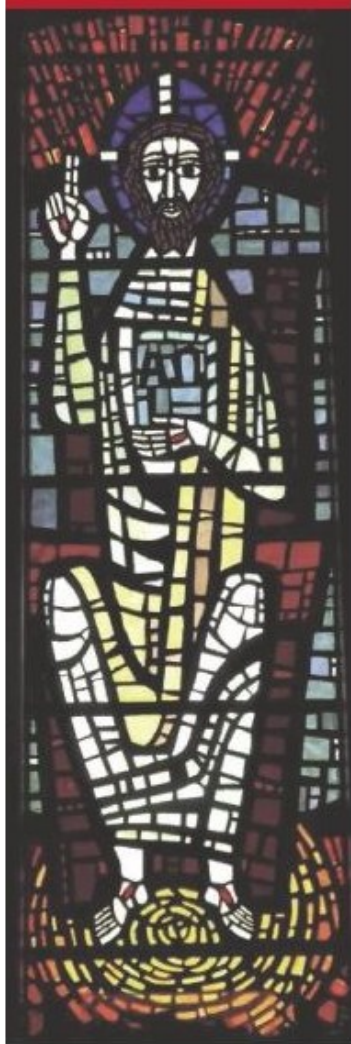

DID YOU KNOW?



Continuing our look at Pope Leo XIV's explanation of the "non-negotiable ... doctrine" of Catholic Social Teaching in his newly-released first encyclical *Magnifica Humanitas*, we see that social justice requires us to not only ensure

fairness to all, especially the most **vulnerable**, but also to **repair** past wounds:

"78. The recent Magisterium has insisted that social justice begins with the least among us. Saint John Paul II spoke of a **preferential option** for the poor [106] that must guide both **personal and societal choices**, while Pope Francis denounced a "'throw away" culture' [107] that generates ever new forms of exclusion. From this perspective, social justice requires us to look at individuals and communities, starting with the most **vulnerable**: the poor, migrants, refugees, internally displaced persons, victims of violence and people living in urban or existential peripheries.

79. The idea of 'social justice' helps us recognize that injustices do not arise solely from the wrong choices of **individuals**, but also from structures, mechanisms and economic and cultural **systems that produce inequality** almost automatically. Saint John Paul II spoke in this vein of **structures of sin** [108] that oppose God's will and require a commitment to personal and social **conversion**. In this perspective, justice is not merely about the **fairer** distribution of resources or the **correction of current injustices**, but also assumes a **restorative** dimension. It aims to mend broken bonds and reintegrate those who have been excluded, taking into account the wounds caused by injustices, such as wars, colonialism, racial or gender discrimination, violence against entire peoples and exploitation. This may include restoring **dignity** and a voice to those who have been ignored, fostering processes of **healing** for collective memory, opposing discriminatory laws and practices, and providing **concrete support** to those who still bear the consequences of wrongs suffered in the past." —Pope Leo XIV, *Magnifica Humanitas* (emphasis added)

Raising awareness and encouraging early conversations can help individuals and families access support, resources, and care sooner.

Healthy Living Tips:

- **Keep your mind active:** Reading, puzzles, learning new skills, and engaging in meaningful conversations can help support brain health.
- **Stay physically active:** Regular exercise improves blood flow to the brain and may help reduce the risk of cognitive decline.
- **Eat a balanced diet:** Foods rich in fruits, vegetables, whole grains, lean proteins, and healthy fats support both brain and heart health.
- **Prioritize quality sleep:** Consistent, restful sleep plays an important role in memory, focus, and overall cognitive function.
- **Stay socially connected:** Spending time with family, friends, and community groups can help reduce isolation and support emotional well-being.
- **Know the warning signs:** Frequent memory loss, confusion, difficulty completing familiar tasks, or changes in mood and behavior should be discussed with a healthcare provider.
- **Support Caregivers:** Caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's or dementia can be emotionally and physically demanding, making self-care and support essential for caregivers as well.

From June 17 through July 20, they will live in community here in Fresno, sharing in the life of our parish and reaching out to the wider community.

Two of our visitors are **Claretian Seminarians**, men in formation for the missionary priesthood in the Congregation of the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

Two others join us as **Discerning Volunteers**, young men prayerfully exploring how God is calling them:
Juan Pablo Gutierrez
Gaspar Fernando Vicente Simon

They come accompanied by **Fr. Agustin Carrillo, CMF**, Vocations Director and Co-Director of the Summer Claretian Experience, whose pastoral care and missionary spirit will guide this season of mission.

The Claretian tradition is animated by apostolic fire, by the conviction that the love of Christ, once truly encountered, cannot be kept to oneself. Saint Anthony Mary Claret, whose heart was described as burning with zeal for God and neighbor, founded his congregation not to build institutions, but to go out: into homes, into streets, into the ordinary lives of ordinary people. These men carry that same spirit into our community this summer.

During their five weeks with us, they will collaborate with local organizations and community partners, walking alongside people on the margins, those whose stories often go unheard. They will visit families in their homes, listen, and build real relationships rooted in faith. They are not here to deliver programs or complete projects. They are here to be present, seeing and being seen, receiving as much as they offer, and discovering Christ alive in the faces of this community.

They will be with us, spending these weeks learning the shape of our neighborhoods, the names behind the faces, and the needs and gifts our communities carry together.
