THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Every culture has bread in some form or other. As a staple of life, bread is common and yet uncommon because it has so many different forms. There's white bread, wheat bread, pumpernickel, French, Italian, pita, tortilla, sour dough, and the list goes on and on. Say the word "bread" and chances are some good image, or taste, or smell, or texture is bound to pop up in our heads.

But Jesus says, "I am the Bread of Life." All of those other breads will grow stale and inedible in a fairly short period of time. Even the manna from heaven that fed the Hebrews in the wilderness was temporary. No, Jesus came offering a new kind of bread, one that doesn't go bad, one that isn't temporary, one that nourishes perpetually and lasts forever, one that sustains relationships and bolsters hope.

In our text from John, we pick up on the heels of Jesus just having fed the 5000 and now they were sticking to him like glue. The miracle of the loaves reminded the people of the manna in the wilderness. "Could this man be the new Moses? Could this guy work wonders for us?" So, they demanded that Jesus prove himself by making some bread from heaven rise up on the spot. Jesus knew they needed more than that, so He gave them Himself instead. But this wasn't exactly what they had in mind. A relationship with this traveling preacher? No, they were thinking more along the lines of escargot, prime rib, semisweet dark chocolate and fine wine. They wanted good food and great signs, they wanted miracles at their beck and call. Jesus corrects them even as He feeds them: It was God, not Moses, who gave the manna in the wilderness and it's God who gives the true bread from heaven, the bread that gives life to the world." "Give us some of that bread!" the people cried. "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst" (John 6:35). Jesus is like manna in that, through Jesus, God reminds us that we live because God provides not what we want, necessarily, but exactly what we need: some food, some love, some breath, some water, and a relationship with the One who is the Bread from heaven. But Jesus is markedly different from the manna in the wilderness in that Jesus feeds us through a relationship.

Relationships are as necessary for life as is bread. That's how we've been created. We need to be in relationship to be fully human. Having said that, however, we also know that the strength of most relationships is paper thin. God knows how fragile our relationships are, how fragile our very lives are, and God knows that we need to be continually fed. That's why God sends the bread from heaven in the person of Jesus Christ. In Jesus, God comes as the Bread of Life: for the sickly and homebound, for the bereaved and bottomed out, for the lost and forgotten and forsaken. In Jesus, God leaves a sign of hope leading to relationship, to community, to communion; and leads us Home.

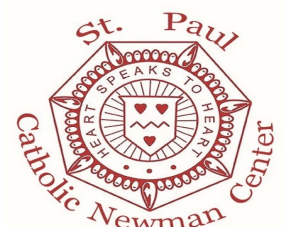
This bread is not only an invitation to life, it is life. This bread gives us life because it's our hope, it's the very life of God in our human world. "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." (John 6: 31)

Weekly Justice Challenge

This week the Church remembers Blessed Pope Paul the VI. One of his most famous quotes is, "If you want peace, work for justice." This idea comes from years of Catholic social teaching responding to the world and the issues at hand in any given age. This statement can be clearly understood today. Just take a look at the civil war in Syria. At the heart of the refugee crisis is a lack of justice from a government that has amassed wealth while the people go hungry or without opportunities for education and participation in decisions that affect them. Followers of Jesus Christ must work to alleviate issues that attack the dignity of the human person – with works of charity and acts of justice. What exactly does that mean? When Syrian refugees are hungry and homeless, we must feed them and help them get the safe homes they deserve. Those would be acts of charity. At the same time, we can encourage our government to pressure the Syrian government to alleviate the problem and find solutions that will benefit the people and ensure the people won't suffer so terribly ever again. Policy and political change are both ways to bring justice. Both are needed to make change happen. Your challenge is to choose an injustice you see in your community. Ask questions about the issue. What do I know about this injustice and what don't I know? Who is affected by the issue? Who has the power to change the issue? Who seeks to gain if the issue isn't resolved? Now... what are YOU going to do about the issue? Start somewhere today.

Parish Registration

There are instances when, as a member of the parish, you must provide verification of membership at the Newman Center. This is necessary as it applies to the administration of Sacraments and the required record-keeping. For this reason, we ask you to please register as a member of the parish.

Verification (written) of membership in this non-territorial parish of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Fresno may be provided for any baptized Catholic who fulfills any of the following:

- **registered in our parish database for a period of six months or more**
- **reference of regular parish involvement by a member of the parish pastoral staff**
- **identification as a regular member of our worshiping community (attendance at Mass on the Lord's Day) by a member of our pastoral staff**

Since we, unlike other Catholic parishes, do not have a specific territorial area, designated by parish boundaries, living in the vicinity of the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center does not automatically mean membership in this parish. (The territorial parish area in which SPCNC is located covers portions of Saint Anthony of Padua parish and Sacred Heart parish.) Hence, personal registration, active involvement and participation in worship and other activities on a regular basis are required to receive any documenting letter (e.g. for purposes of being a Catholic sponsor/godparent) of membership in SPCNC.

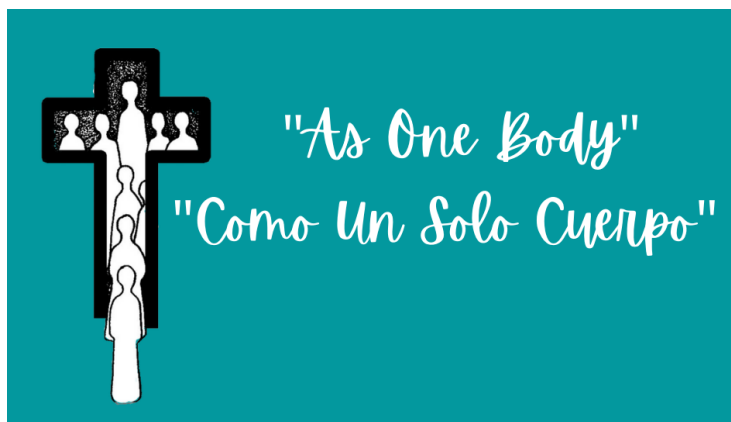

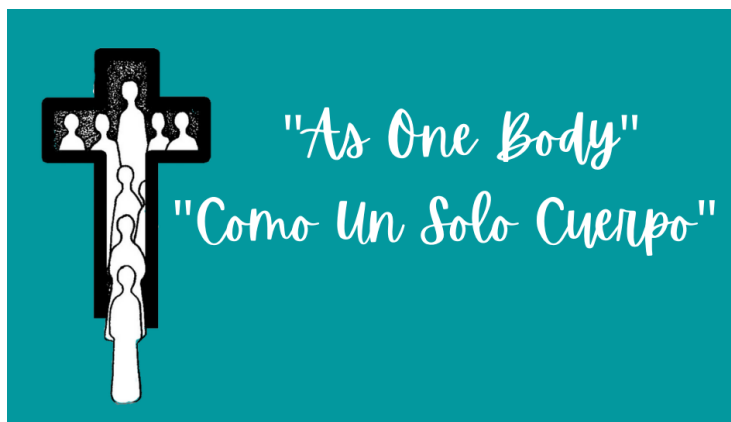

Food from Heaven

This Week's Readings at Mass

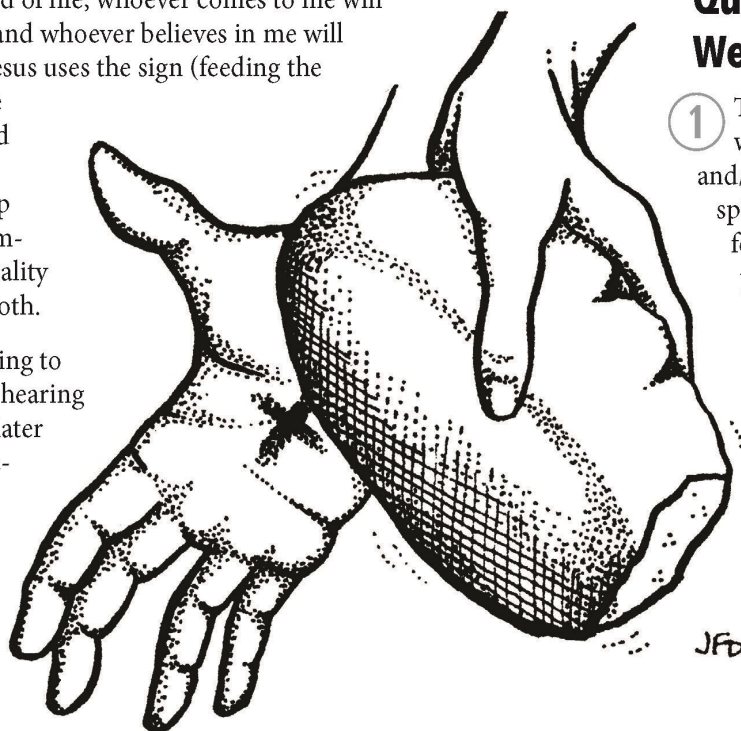
- ▶ Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15 - Manna in the desert
- ▶ Ephesians 4:17, 20-24 - Renewal in Christ
- ▶ John 6:24-35 - Jesus as the bread of life

John's Gospel is full of symbolism and metaphors and great "signs" that Jesus works to demonstrate the truth behind the metaphors. The sixth chapter, which we are in the midst of reading for four weeks now, is a perfect example of this.

First, today, we are reminded how Jesus fed the vast crowd beginning with just two loaves and five fish. This piques the curiosity of the crowd who follows Jesus to learn more about who he is, where he comes from, and what else he might do. His sign of feeding the crowd in the desert had reminded them of how God supplied their ancestors with manna in the desert when they were in danger of starving after they escaped from Egypt. Jesus points out that it was not Moses who produced the manna, but his Father in heaven. In the same way, Jesus tells them, *he* has come down from heaven to give life to the world.

At this point, he makes the incredulous claim that "I AM the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." Jesus uses the sign (feeding the crowd) and the metaphor (food gives life) and takes it one step further by claiming to be the reality behind them both.

The Jews listening to Jesus then and hearing this story told later would have recognized with a shock the play on words when Jesus said:



"What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you?"

Sheepish Question:

What does God's constant, overabundant giving mean to me?

"I AM the bread of life." The phrase "I AM" is the great phrase God ("Yahweh") used to name himself in the Old Testament when Moses met God at the burning bush. (Exodus 3). Jesus is clearly equating himself here with God!

Questions of the Week

- 1 Think of a time in your life when you need food (literally) and/or mental, emotional, or spiritual nourishment. In what form did the manna come to you?
- 2 What does it mean to you when Jesus says "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger"?
