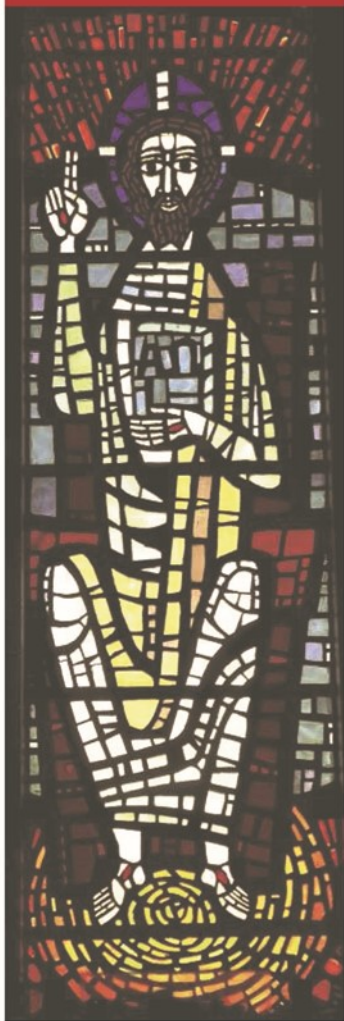

THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This week's gospel is part of the centerpiece of Jesus' ministry. For the entire history of the Hebrew people, there has been an understanding of retribution – a reckoning. If someone fails the community, he or she is punished. The laws laid out in the Hebrew Scriptures govern everyday life. These laws have kept the people of Israel intact, despite all odds. Here, Jesus presents a new law that is in radical opposition to what the Hebrew people expect from the Lord who chose them. In Matthew's gospel, Jesus tells His disciples that He has come not to abolish, but to fulfill the law (5:17). Here, in Luke's gospel, is where that happens.

It's only radical for Jesus' time. This week it's worth the time to read the gospel a few times over, maybe even out loud. This is God's word! This is what Jesus is telling you to do! There's no asterisk or extra contest. This is it! Love your enemies. Pray for those who mistreat you. Lend, expecting nothing back. Stop judging. Stop condemning. Forgive. That's it! That's the point. That's how we get to heaven.

It's fitting that this week with the gospel calling us to radical and unending love, there is also a letter from Paul reminding the Corinthians of the divinity of Jesus as the New Adam. If the gospel is meant to make us uncomfortable and challenge our inherently sinful nature, the second reading reminds us that it's because of Adam that we have this nature, and a tendency to hate our enemies. We need Jesus, not only because His words are spiritual nourishment, but because through His death He undoes original sin and gives us the opportunity to be participants in the heavenly kingdom.

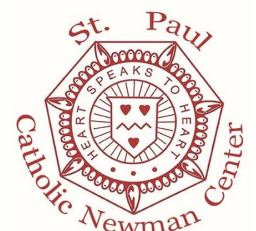
We are called to "bear the image" of Christ in our words and deeds. This is intimidating, but not impossible, or else we wouldn't be asked to do it. Go back to the gospel and find the line that bothers you the most. Maybe it's something you're not great at doing everyday – like being good to the people who aren't kind to you. Maybe you have a tendency to judge those with whom you interact a lot. Pick the line that speaks to you, in your current situation and sit with it for a while.

Parish Registration

There are instances when, as a member of the parish, you must provide verification of membership at the Newman Center. This is necessary as it applies to the administration of Sacraments and the required record-keeping. For this reason, we ask you to please register as a member of the parish.

Verification (written) of membership in this non-territorial parish of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Fresno may be provided for any baptized Catholic who fulfills any of the following:

- **registered in our parish database for a period of six months or more**
- **reference of regular parish involvement by a member of the parish pastoral staff**
- **identification as a regular member of our worshipping community (attendance at Mass on the Lord's Day) by a member of our pastoral staff**

Since we, unlike other Catholic parishes, do not have a specific territorial area, designated by parish boundaries, living in the vicinity of the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center does not automatically mean membership in this parish. (The territorial parish area in which SPCNC is located covers portions of Saint Anthony of Padua parish and Sacred Heart parish.) Hence, personal registration, active involvement and participation in worship and other activities on a regular basis are required to receive any documenting letter (e.g. for purposes of being a Catholic sponsor/godparent) of membership in SPCNC.

Creation Care Tips

"Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to others as you would have them do to you." —Luke 6:30-31 You've probably seen ads in which one neighbor is using a tool, then another neighbor comes along, admires how well it works, and then declares that he's going to get himself one too. It's enough to make you want to wonder: "Why don't you just ask to borrow it?" Instead of accumulating tons of tools for all our needs, let's thank those generous neighbors who are willing to lend them to us. In exchange, we might have a tool or a service our neighbor needs. Neighbors could even chip in together to buy a bread machine, a lawnmower, a hedge clipper, or a snow blower. Yes, it might take shy folks or introverts a bit of energy to muster the courage to ask to borrow something, but the relationships that can be built over sharing, borrowing, and trading can be priceless.

Weekly Justice Challenge

Justice Challenge: Luke's Gospel for Sunday presents some of the biggest challenges Jesus has ever given us. We are asked to love our enemies, stop judging people, turn the other cheek, and give to those in need. These are life-changing actions, each one demanding hearts of love and mercy. Your challenge this week is to choose someone or some group which you have looked on as the "enemy" in the past because they have hurt you or someone you love. Perhaps you are holding onto a grudge against the person(s). Instead, offer forgiveness! Let go of the past and find a way to help the person be who God created him or her to be.

"Do Unto Others..." Tough Teachings

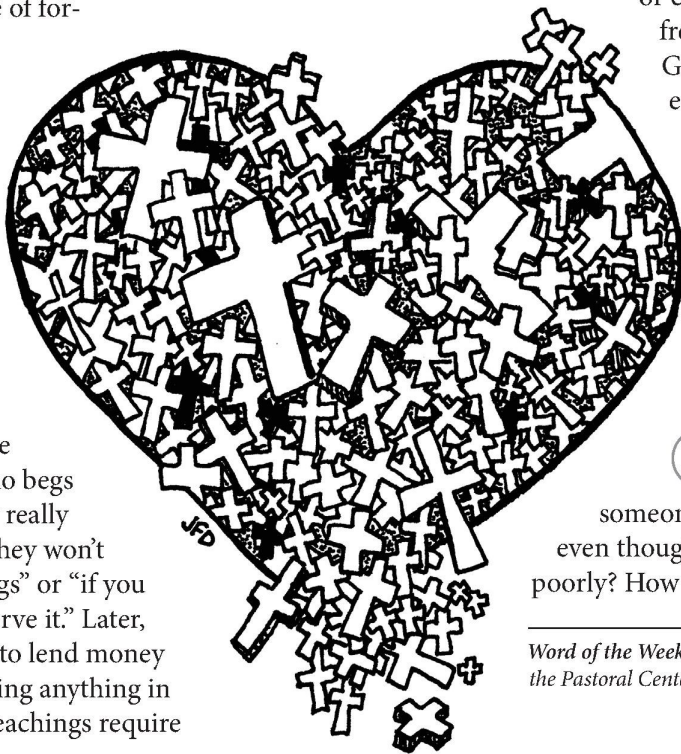
This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23 - Saul's life spared
- ▶ 1 Corinthians 15:45-49 - The natural and the spiritual body
- ▶ Luke 6:27-38 - Love of enemies

The Gospel passage today is a long one, and it is packed full of instructions for those who want to live like Jesus. We can group the teachings here into several categories: how to treat enemies or those who provoke you, how to respond to those who ask things of you, and how to relate to others with whom you disagree or disapprove.

Some people may be fortunate enough to be in a place in life where they don't feel that they have enemies. Jesus' teaching to "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you... pray for those who abuse you" might seem like a non-issue. Perhaps these lucky ones can bring greater love into the world by spending effort and energy on loving, blessing, and praying for the "enemies" of those in their families, churches, or nation who have been hurt but haven't come to a place of forgiveness yet.

Jesus' words about giving to those who ask something of us calls for a disciplined generosity. Notice that he doesn't say "give to everyone who begs of you—if they really need it" or "if they won't waste it on drugs" or "if you think they deserve it." Later, he instructs us to lend money without expecting anything in return. These teachings require

a stance of openness, generosity, non-judgment, and trust that God will work with our giving even if we can't see how.

Finally, several verses focus on how to relate to those we encounter. Jesus says we should not judge or condemn; we should forgive and give freely. It is another way of teaching the Golden Rule, with the promise that eventually "what goes around comes around."

Questions of the Week

- 1 What line in the Gospel reading challenges you the most on a personal level? How so?
- 2 When have you enacted the Golden Rule, stretching to treat someone as you would want to be treated, even though your instinct was to treat them poorly? How did the situation turn out?
