Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C

February 6, 2022

Readings: Is 6:1-2a, 3-8; 1 Cor 15:1-11; Lk 5:1-11

And more were added to their number (ACTS 2:47)

At the 11.30am Mass this morning, another five young men and women will go through their Rite of Acceptance as part of their journey to the Catholic Faith. Three are baptized and will proceed to confirmation. They will be called candidates. Two are not baptized and they will receive all three sacraments at Easter next year. They will be called Catechumens. These five will join eleven others already in the Catechumenate.

Providentially, the readings at Mass today are about God's call of different individuals – Isaiah in the first reading, Paul in the second, and the apostles in the Gospel reading, that He called to become "fishers of men" instead of the fishermen they were. In the same way, He is calling these sixteen candidates and catechumens today.

So many Catholics do not experience their faith as a personal call by God. Instead, they see being Catholic is as an obligation to make sure they attend Sunday Mass, follow the rules of the Church and generally be a nice person. Or some happened to be born Catholic and that is what the family did, just a habit or a custom. Our candidates or catechumens are no different. They often see joining the Church almost like joining a club or something to get done because they are marrying a Catholic. That may be where they start but through the RCIA process they come to understand their call as much larger than becoming a member of the Catholic Church. First, it is an invitation to be a child of God. They can call God "Abba" (Daddy) as Paul puts it or as Isaiah puts it, become "God's delight". How many of us experience our faith as being God's delight? Second, it is a call to discipleship, to carry His cross and follow Him, loving and healing and spreading the Good News like He did.

What is common in the call of Isaiah, Paul and the apostles is that all of them felt unworthy and inadequate. That is how most of us and the candidates and catechumens feel, but there is power in God's call. It is not just an invitation, but the call itself, carries with it the power of God, to transform us and makes us adequate so that with Paul we can say, "Not I but the grace of God that is with me."

The five inquirers you will meet today are Abdulaziz Al-Said, Marisol Contreras, Roxanne Castillo and Melissa and Fernando Chavez. Give them the Newman welcome.

"Jesus said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch."—Luke 5:4

Fish and marine life represent the main protein source for over one billion human beings. However, modern-day fishing techniques are qualified as "over-fishing" which takes a toll on many species, some of which have become endangered. If you have plentiful sources of other protein, consider reducing your consumption of fish and seafood so that those who must rely on it can. When you do purchase fish or seafood, look for the blue MSC certification label (Marine Stewardship Council) or check for the best options by printing out a card from SeafoodWatch.org.

Weekly Justice Challenge

Justice Challenge: This Sunday's Gospel has Jesus inviting Peter, James, and John to become fishers of people. God's Word tells us that they left everything to follow Jesus. Your challenge this week is to reflect on something which you haven't been able to leave, something which might stand between you and Jesus. It might be a possession; it might be an activity that consumers a lot of your time. Give it up and replace it with giving time or money to a cause which fights injustice and helps those in need. Have a conversation with Jesus about why and how you want to be closer to him. And listen for his response.


They Thought They Weren't Qualified

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8 Call of Isaiah
- ▶ 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 Christ's resurrection
- ► Luke 5:1-11 Call of the first disciples

It is still early in Jesus' public life when he stands preaching at the shore of the Lake of Gennesaret (a.k.a. Sea of Galilee). He draws such a big crowd that he climbs into Simon Peter's boat so the people can better see and hear him. We don't know what he was teaching them about, but they seemed transfixed by his words.

We don't know what Peter and his companions were thinking when Jesus invited himself into their boat. But Peter is taken aback when Jesus tells him to go fishing again after he already fished all night with no luck. Maybe there's something about the way that Jesus looks at him that makes Peter decide "Ok, if you say so..." The amazing catch of fish follows, and the realization hits Peter that Jesus is more than just a good speaker. Like Isaiah and Paul in the other readings today, Peter suddenly realizes he is in the presence of God, and he feels "unworthy."



Luckily for us, we get yet another example of God's response to fear with the encouragement "Do not be afraid." That is followed by the assurance that God can use *anyone* to do his good work in the world, no matter how unworthy we might think we are.


