The Baptism of Our Lord, Year B January 10, 2021 Readings: IS 42: 1-4, 6-7; ACTS 10: 34-38; МК 1:7-11

#### The Deacon's Speakin'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

A religion may have appeal when it imposes few demands on its followers, but this is not the case of the religion of the prophet Isaiah and it's certainly not the religion of Jesus Christ. In the first reading today, Isaiah speaks in God's name to the chosen people. Those words are offered to all of us as a challenge to do God's work. God didn't "choose": this people (us) to be preserved as museum pieces, but to be a light to all nations. Mark's gospel speaks of the baptism of Jesus. This wasn't only a purification ritual; it was also a rite of commission. Immediately following His baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan River, Jesus began His public ministry. As we read in the gospel passage, we are baptized not only in water, but baptized with the Holy Spirit. This means we are empowered to do what Jesus did – **Go about doing good.** 

Most of us understand that the church has a mission, but not ourselves personally. We see baptism as a "christening", but not as commissioning to perform a ministry. We experience close union with Jesus in Holy Communion, but we're not inclined to feel this same union when we're delegated by Him, to carry out His work. For many of us religion remains "private". We see ourselves as members of a church rather than servants – doers – of a cause.

The truth is – We are baptized for a cause. Baptism commissions us to do the work of Jesus according to our capabilities. It is our duty to teach, counsel, admonish, heal, forgive, comfort, feed the hungry, be a light to those in darkness, whenever other people need such help and we're in a position to offer that service. Not a day goes by that we don't take note of people who need a helping hand, a kind word, a touch of sympathy, a piece of welcomed advice, a warning, a sign of peace, a prayer, an answer to a pressing question. These are all opportunities for us to perform acts of ministry.

Do you speak out when you see someone being treated unjustly? Pray that you can be a person of justice in whom God can be well-pleased as He was with his Son.

# **Come! Listen!**

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Isaiah 55:1-11 Invitation to abundance
- ▶ 1 John 5:1-9 God's testimony of love
- Mark 1:7-11 The baptism of Jesus

Although baptism as Christians know it didn't exist in the time before Jesus, Jews did - and still do practice cleansing and purification rituals. If we think about how the Israelites lived so much of their history in a dry and dusty region, it's not a surprise that there is a lot of emphasis on water in their culture and religion. There are some places in the Middle East that are lush and fertile, but for the nomadic tribes who made up the early Jewish people, lush and fertile weren't the norm.

In the first reading from Isaiah today, Isaiah wrote to people who lived in a land where water was extremely precious - for basic survival and cleanliness. His ringing invitation, "Everyone who thirsts, come to the waters" could be read literally, as in "We've found a source of water! Come and get a drink! Wash yourselves!" Or we can read it metaphorically, as we do at the Easter Vigil when the catechumens who have been preparing for baptism are finally called to the baptismal font. As an RCIA Director, I see every year how the catechumens' spiritual thirst grows as they realize that the "stuff" of our culture can't slake their spiritual thirst. They are learning to seek out "living water" that will satisfy them in a way that physical necessities can't.

Isaiah's proclamation reminds us that God offers us all we need for our spiritual food. It's all free and available to everyone; we just need to know where to look. Hint: our spiritual food won't be found scrolling through social media, or on the news, or in watching how the Joneses next door are living. May-

be it's heartening, or maybe it's discouraging, but the people Isaiah was writing to over 2,000 years ago struggled with the same things we do today — spending money "for that which is not bread" and working for



"that which does not satisfy." Just like them, Isaiah is calling us to reevaluate our lives and our priorities.

Isaiah tells us we have to make an effort to listen to God and to "seek the Lord." How do we do that? It will look different for every person. It might be waking up 15 minutes before family members to have quiet time with God while sipping coffee. Maybe it's journaling at the end of the day. Perhaps it's joining a prayer group to connect with others who are seeking God too. Perhaps it's going for a walk at lunchtime to clear your mind, or calling a loved one to ask for advice or support. However it is that you can make time to open some space, "incline your ear" to hear what God is speaking.

#### **Questions of the Week**

What are you thirsting or hungering for that money can't buy?

What do you spend your money on that does not satisfy? What do you consume (physically or otherwise) that is not nourishing?
