The Baptism of the Lord, Year C

January 9, 2021

Readings: Is 42:1-4, 6-7; Acts 10:34-38; Lk 3:15-16, 21-22

Dear Newman Community,

1. In response to Pope Francis' call for a worldwide consultation on the Church, St. Paul Catholic Newman Center has formed a preliminary "Synod Engagement Committee", and we are definitely looking for more members.

2. "Synod" means "Same path, or Walking together" and it is the Holy Father's proposal to prepare for the Bishops' Synod in 2023 by having Catholics (and interested non-Catholics) spend the first months of 2022 in various "Listening Sessions", where participants will be invited by facilitators to respond personally to questions related to ten different aspects of Church life:

1. What is the quality of our journeying together? How could we improve it?
2. Are we listening to each other? Whom do we need to listen to more? The young? Women? Minority groups?
3. Are we invited to speak out and share our concerns with charity, and boldness? What would encourage you and others to participate more fully?
4. Do our parish Masses and other communal prayers strengthen our sense of community and mission and inspire our "journeying together"?
5. Rooted in our Baptism, are we prepared and supported and welcomed to participate in the mission of proclaiming the Gospel?
6. Is there a place for parish members to dialogue openly, including with those who have suffered in silence? Which persons and groups do we need to learn from?
7. What can we learn from other churches and believers? How well does your parish "journey together" with other communities of faith? What makes this difficult?
8. How does your parish identify pastoral goals, and steps to achieve them? Do you feel valued and invited to share? What steps can we take together?
9. How does your parish exercise discernment in decision making and prayerful listening and obedience to the Holy Spirit?
10. How does your parish prepare you to be a missionary disciple of Jesus Christ? As we form ourselves in synodality, where will our next steps take us?

3. I hope these "Listening Sessions" sound as exciting to you as they do to me. Please join me in attending an Informational Zoom session given by the Diocese of Fresno on January 12 and 20. You'll find a way to register for that zoom session and so much more at the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center Synod Website.



Weekly Justice Challenge

Justice Challenge: This is National Migration Week. To welcome migrants and refugees with joy and generosity, while responding to their many needs;
To realize that you call all people to your holy mountain to learn the ways of peace and justice;
To share of our abundance as you spread a banquet before us;
To give witness to your love for all people, as we celebrate the many gifts they bring.

We praise you and give you thanks for the family you have called together from so many people. We see in this human family a reflection of the divine unity of the one Most Holy Trinity in whom we make our prayer: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.





You Are God's Beloved


This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7 - The servant of the Lord
- ▶ Acts 10:34-38 - The good news of peace
- ▶ Luke 3:15-16, 21-22 - Baptism of Jesus

John the Baptist is an intriguing figure in the Gospel of Luke. Immediately before this passage, John was drawing large crowds to listen to him speak. He wasn't coming into the big city and towns to tour; he was staying out in the desert region, in Jewish history a place symbolic of hardship, trial, and personal encounter with God.

John had the reputation of being a bit of a wild man out there, dressed in camel's hair and eating locusts and wild honey while preaching repentance. The people were going out in droves to see for themselves who this man was that everyone was talking about. Obviously, there was something compelling about what John was saying and how he was living. Many were so taken by his message that they wondered if he was the promised Christ. Their respect for him didn't go to John's head, however, and he remained humble, insisting that he was only a servant for Christ.

In the next scene, Jesus has just been baptized when the voice from heaven announces, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Lk. 3:22). It is a touching, intimate statement of God's love for his son. Any parent who has brought a child for baptism could easily say the same. If we believe that God loves us even more than we can imagine loving others, then it is

not a leap to say that as adopted sons and daughters of God, we can trust that God feels the same for us.
