



### **Preventing Heat-Related Illness and Death**

As heatwaves take over the Central Valley, the Fresno County Department of Public Health (FCDPH) is asking medical providers to help prevent heat-related illness and death by providing guidance to patients who are at increased risk and their caregivers.

This summer, the risk of COVID-19 transmission must continue to be balanced against the risk of heat-related illness. During hot weather, staying in un-air-conditioned homes can increase risk for heat-related death or illness. Medical providers can help by identifying patients who are at-risk of heat-related illness, reminding them of the health risks of extreme heat (heatwaves), sharing information on how they can access cooling and utility assistance when needed, and encouraging them to plan how to find relief from the heat.

### Guidance for people at greatest risk to heat related illness or death

- Remind people that heatwaves can be dangerous.
- Encourage them to monitor weather alerts and make sure they have a plan for cooling relief during extreme heat.
- Encourage people to use their air conditioners. Suggest setting air conditioners to 78
  degrees or "low" cool to provide comfort, save on electricity costs, and conserve
  energy.
- Guide people without air conditioning or with financial concerns about using home air conditioning to consider family, friends or neighbors they can visit even for a couple of hours to stay cool during a heatwave.
  - People who are fully vaccinated can visit fully vaccinated family, friends and neighbors without physical distancing and face coverings. Those who are not fully vaccinated should continue to practice physical distancing and wear face

Categories of Health Alert Messages:

**Health Alert:** Conveys the highest level of importance; warrants immediate action or attention **Health Advisory:** Provides important information for a specific incident or situation; may not require immediate action **Health Update:** Provides updated information regarding an incident or situation; unlikely to require immediate action **Health Information:** Provides general health information which is not considered to be of emergent nature



### **Preventing Heat-Related Illness and Death**

- coverings when gathering with others, especially if they are at increased risk of severe COVID-19 or gathering with other unvaccinated individuals.
- The California Department of Public Health and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention no longer recommended that vaccinated individuals wear a mask in indoor public settings. However, masks are required for unvaccinated individuals in indoor public settings and businesses.
- Let people know that the FCDPH will share a list of alternative cooling spaces during a heatwave. Also, people can also call Valley 211 or go to <a href="http://www.fcdph.org/extremeheat">http://www.fcdph.org/extremeheat</a> to find a cooling center in Fresno County.
- Advise people to increase fluid intake during hot weather.
- Recommend self-monitoring of hydration, such as body weight measurement, for people who have health conditions sensitive to fluid balance or use medications that can impair thermoregulation or cause dehydration.
- Engage caregivers and other support networks to frequently call or otherwise remotely check on heat-vulnerable people to help them stay cool and well-hydrated before and during hot weather.
- Remind them that all hot weather including but not limited to heatwaves can be dangerous and help them develop a plan to stay cool.
- Discuss with people and their caregivers about the signs and symptoms of heatrelated illness or risk of exacerbating chronic medical conditions associated with excessive heat and provide guidance about when to call 911 or go to the emergency department.



### **Leave it All Behind**

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Amos 7:12-15 Amos called by God to prophecy
- ► Ephesians 1:3-14 Blessing for Jew and Gentile
- ► Mark 6:7-13 The mission of the Twelve

The instructions Jesus gives to the twelve apostles in this Gospel reading are still relevant for us today, even if we don't think we are called to leave our home and families to be traveling missionaries.



First, the note that Jesus sends disciples out two by two echoes throughout the rest of the New Testament. Why did Jesus want his disciples to travel in pairs? As a human himself, he recognized the value of companionship. We are social beings, and even introverts need the support, wisdom, and love of others. Being a disciple is challenging, and we can burn out quickly if we don't have others to help us on our journey. Also, a spouse (and St. Paul makes it clear that some of the pairs that were missionaries together were married couples), friend, or fellow disciple can be a sounding board, consultant, or trusted confidante as we navigate the questions and difficulties of our discipleship work.

Traveling in pairs or larger groups also forces people to confront their selfishness and practice "walking the walk" rather than just

"talking the talk." It's easy to preach love and repentance, but harder to model it, especially with the people we are closest to.

The disciples are challenged to take



nothing for their journey but a walking stick. Talk about an exercise in trust and detachment! Just imagining setting out like that challenges us to evaluate what we are attached to materially.

Finally, Jesus teaches the disciples to appreciate and receive the gifts of those who treat them well and to walk away when they are not accepted. This is yet another invitation to trust: trust others who want to share generously, and trust that there are times and places we are not called to stay.

### **Questions of the Week**

What material comforts might Jesus be inviting you to leave behind to be a freer and more faithful disciple?

When have you felt the call to shake the dust from your feet and leave (a relationship, job, etc.) to go somewhere else where you are welcome?


