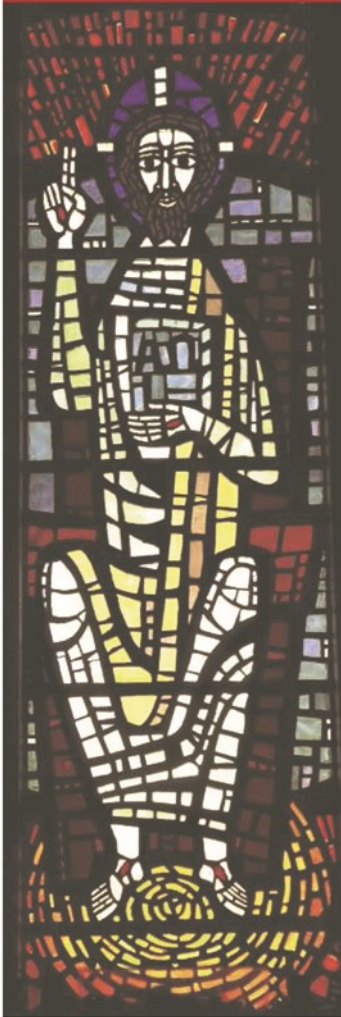

The Deacon's Speakin'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today most of us are not in danger of being too familiar with Jesus the way those from His hometown were. We're not rejecting the carpenter who was Mary's son. But we can be effectively blind to the presence of Jesus in our midst in the modern world. We can reject those we confine to the margins of society. Who is that – a homeless person – a beggar – an immigrant – an undocumented person? What does that person know that we don't already know? What wisdom could that person possibly have that we don't already possess?

There's a temptation in the religious world and even in secular society to believe that we have all that we need to be complete and whole. There is very little that another person, especially on the margins, could teach us about how to act, how to behave, or anything about God.

That is exactly how the Nazarenes behaved with respect to Jesus. They thought they understood who He was. They knew His family and His background. What more did they need to know? In their minds, this "upstart" was "too big for his britches". They took offense at Him, yet God was effectively in their midst.

Let us ask God to keep us open to finding the new and the unexpected. Let's not grow too familiar that we fail to see the presence of God all around us.

Listen to Pope Francis

Two UN conferences. One opportunity for Catholics worldwide to listen to Pope Francis and act out our faith. (Read more at Global Catholic Climate Movement.)

Part 1: State of Our Common Home

Our common home and common family are suffering. The climate emergency is causing rising seas, a warmer planet, and more extreme weather. It's devastating the lives of our poorest sisters and brothers.

At the same time, biologists estimate that we're driving species to extinction at a rate of 100 to 1,000 times their usual rate. "We have no such right" (Laudato Si' 33).

The Year 2021

We have an opportunity like no other. At the UN Biodiversity Conference (COP15) in October, world leaders can set meaningful targets to protect creation.

In November, at the 26th UN Climate Change Conference (COP26), countries will announce their plans to meet the goals of the Paris agreement. Ahead of those meetings, it is our responsibility as Catholics to lift up the voices of the most vulnerable and advocate on their behalf. We must act now.

Part 2: Our ask

- Tackle the climate emergency and biodiversity crisis together
- Limit warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius and promise no more biodiversity loss
- Ensure equitable global action, including support for those most affected
- Protect and respect human rights, including the rights of Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities in climate and biodiversity action

Part 3: Why?

When Catholics come together and live out our faith, amazing things happen. Just look at how Pope Francis' Laudato Si' has enlivened Catholics everywhere to care for creation.

Ahead of the Paris agreement in 2015, Catholics were leading the way, advocating for an agreement that limited warming to 1.5 degrees. Some said it couldn't be done, but with the Holy Spirit leading the way, we did it! We're going to do it again this year.

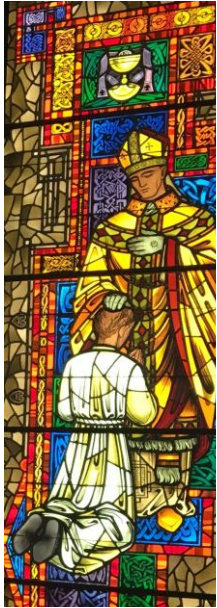

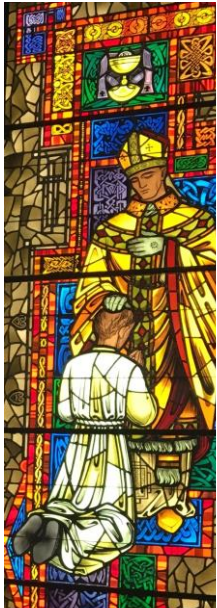

A Thorn in His Side

This Week's Readings at Mass

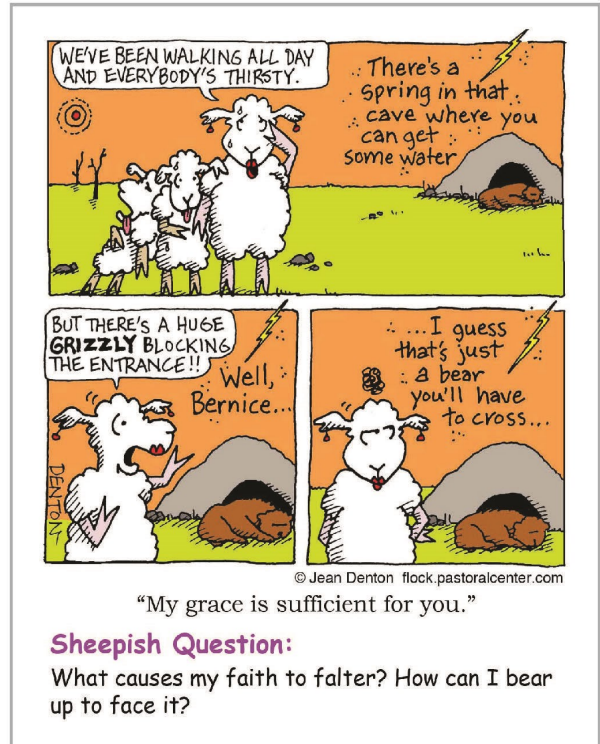
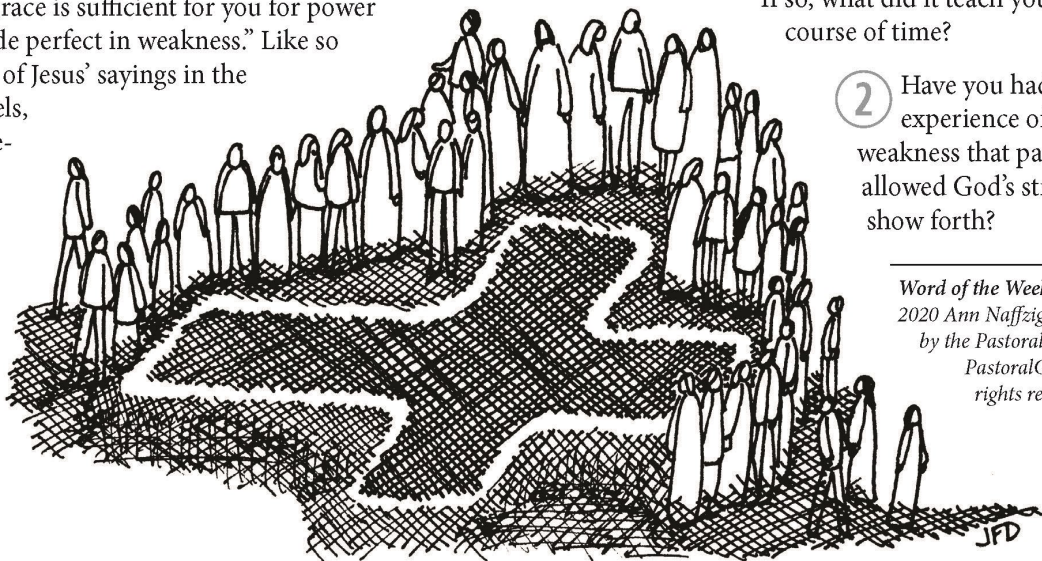
- ▶ Ezekiel 2:2-5 - The Lord speaks to Ezekiel
- ▶ 2 Corinthians 12:7-10 - Paul's weakness
- ▶ Mark 6:1-6 - Jesus at Nazareth

The Old Testament, Epistle, and Gospel readings today all give reminders of the hardships endured by God's prophets. We'll focus on the second reading from Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians.

Immediately before this passage, Paul has been writing to the church community in Corinth about all that he has endured for the sake of spreading the Good News. Five times he was whipped, three times he was beaten with rods, and once he was stoned. He was shipwrecked three times, survived a day and night on the sea, and in his travels endured "many sleepless nights, in hunger and thirst and frequent fastings, in cold and nakedness" (2 Cor 11:24-28).

Now he has another challenge: "a thorn in the flesh." He never tells us what the thorn in the flesh is. Is it a physical sickness or handicap? Could it refer to a person, someone he finds almost intolerable? We will never know, but we can probably relate to a challenging or painful situation that we wish we didn't have to experience.

St. Paul begged for his thorn to be removed, but the response he heard from the Lord was "My grace is sufficient for you for power is made perfect in weakness." Like so many of Jesus' sayings in the Gospels, this re-



sponse is a surprise and it challenges our understanding of how God works. Paul manages to accept this and make a shift to humility, accepting his thorn, so that God can work with and through him, despite his imperfections. Ultimately he allows God to be in control, rather than himself.

- 1 Have you had an experience of living with a thorn in your side? If so, what did it teach you over the course of time?
- 2 Have you had an experience of living with weakness that paradoxically allowed God's strength to show forth?
