THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today we celebrate Father's Day. Fathers understand well the responsibility and privilege of calling their children to strive beyond where they are at any stage in their lives - for example, encouraging a toddler to walk, a youngster to ride a bike, a teenager to make the right decisions, etc. Basic to this process is parents teaching their children to trust their own innate abilities and talents and grow into capable and independent adults. Our faith journey is a similar process.

In our own lives, one of the questions people seem to wrestle with is the seeming absence of God in the face of evil in the world. Whether it be the suffering and death of a child, or the horrific nature of institutionalized evil, people's faith begins to falter. It's difficult to know where to find God when the greed of a few can bring about the instability of the entire world. People wonder if God is even aware of our problems. The natural tendency is to cry out to God, as did the disciples in the boat, "Don't you care?" Meanwhile Jesus looks at us and says, "Why do you have such little faith? Do you believe and trust only when you have no troubles in your life?"

Jesus is the parent, mother, and father, who calls us His disciples today, to go beyond our own previous experiences and limited understanding of His presence in our lives. In the storms of our own lives Jesus is always present - through other people, within ourselves, in the very challenges of each situation. Each challenge in life offers us more and more reasons to trust in Jesus - concrete evidence of our continued growth in faith.

Weekly Justice Challenge

Judging is a topic in the readings this week. It is something we all do whether we admit it or not. At a particular parish, there was a once woman who was in charge of the St. Vincent DePaul chapter and did all the intake of clients who needed assistance. One day, a pregnant woman with three small children came to the office for help. Jeanne remarked to the woman that she obviously couldn't afford the children she had so why another one? She and her husband died in a car accident two months ago. We were blessed to be given custody of the children. Of course we weren't prepared for this and I had to quit work to care for them, and we are temporarily in a bind." The challenge this week is to catch yourself when you are tempted to make a snap judgment before you seek understanding.

Calm During the Storm

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Job 38:1, 8-11 The Lord's speech to Job
- ▶ 2 Corinthians 5:14-17 The ministry of reconciliation
- ► Mark 4:35-41 The storm on the sea

The first reading and the Psalm response for the day (Ps 107:23-31) testify to God's power over nature, in this case, the sea. In biblical times, the sea represented the forces of chaos. God tells Job in no uncertain terms that God is in charge of the sea - God sets its boundaries, and the sea obeys his commands. The Psalm relates an account of sailors who experienced God's saving power when they cried out to him during a storm on the sea, and God responded by calming the storm. When Jesus ordered the wind to be still, those in the boat with him would have made the connection between Jesus calming the storm and God calming storms in earlier Bible stories.

Most of us can probably relate to the disciples who fear for their lives when they are in the midst of the storm on the sea. There is a great windstorm going on, and the waves are swamping the boat. Who wouldn't be afraid? Apparently, not Jesus, who is so calm that the disciples find it hard to believe that he could sleep through the danger.

Looking back on our lives, we can probably identify storms we have lived through that ended with safety and peace. Maybe as a mother, you have agonized about your child's physical or mental health crisis, and now you can see how Jesus was with you the whole time. Maybe you have come through a professional or career crisis that you feared would swamp you, but you made it safely to another shore. Or perhaps you've endured the death of a loved one which you thought couldn't survive, but somehow you have come to find peace despite the loss.

Sheepish Question:


When have the forces of nature challenged my faith in God's power?

Perhaps the invitation in this passage is to recognize, like the disciples, that we will live through storms. Just because we follow Jesus doesn't mean things will be easy. Yet we can choose between reacting in fear and panic, or looking to Jesus in trust and asking that he help us keep a calm head during the storm.

Questions of the Week

When have you experienced a turbulent time but realized that Jesus brought you safely to the other side?

How can you cultivate a greater sense of trust when you experience something challenging now, i.e., what can you do to keep your eyes on Jesus who is calm even in the midst of a storm?
