Second Sunday of Lent, Year C March 13, 2022 Readings: Gn 15:5-12, 17-18; Phil 3:17-4:1; Lk 9:28b-36

Dear Newman Community,

Beginning this week (March 13), the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center will begin the "Listening Sessions" which are the heart of the "Synodal Process" which Pope Francis has called the Church to spend the next 2 years developing.

"Synod" means "Same path or Walking together" and it is the Holy Father's proposal to prepare for the Bishops' Synod in October 2023 by having Catholics (and interested non-Catholics) across the world respond to 10 questions on the parish and diocesan levels in 2022.

Parish "Listening Sessions" will take place in March, April, and May 2022 with a ten page summary of parish responses handed in to the Diocese by June 1. The Diocese will then review all parish reports and summarize them in a ten page diocesan report which will be sent to Rome no later than August 1, 2022.

The 2,000 Diocesan reports will be reviewed in Rome from August 2022 through October 2023. In that month Bishops and other Catholic leaders from around the world will meet to produce a Final Document for Pope Francis' review.

The Synod on Synodality is "not an event, but a process that involves in synergy the People of God, the College of Bishops and the Bishop of Rome, each according to their proper function".

THE MOST IMPORTANT PART OF THE SYNOD PROCESS IS NOT THE "COMPILING OF THE REPORTS" BUT WHAT HAPPENS DURING THE "LISTENING SESSIONS" WHEN THE PEOPLE OF GOD, INSPIRED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT, SHARE WHAT FILLS THEIR HEARTS WITH JOY ABOUT THE CHURCH AND WHAT BREAKS THEIR HEART ABOUT THE SAME CHURCH. WHAT THE HOLY SPIRIT WORKS IN THESE GROUPS AND HOW THE LOCAL CHURCH RESPONDS TO THE CONCERNS EXPRESSED IS HOW THE "SYNOD PROCESS" WILL GUIDE THE CHURCH GOING FORWARD.

The St. Paul Catholic Newman Center staff will begin with listening sessions on March 14, and parish members will reflect on questions 1,2 and 3 on March 15, questions 4,5 and 6 on March 22, and questions 7,8,9,10 on March 29. "Faith Family and Friends" will meet in Chapel from 6:00-7:00 PM on those evenings, and other parish members who call the parish office to register (559-436-3434) will be able to meet on those evenings and respond to those questions from 7:00-8:00 PM.

Here are the ten questions related to ten different aspects of Church life which participants will be invited by facilitators to respond to personally on those Tuesday evenings, and at other times which will be offered during April and May:

- 1. What is the quality of our journeying together? How could we improve it?
- 2. Are we listening to each other? Whom do we need to listen to more? The young? Women? Minority groups?
- 3. Are we invited to speak out and share our concerns with charity and boldness? What would encourage you and others to participate more fully?
- 4. Do our parish Masses and other communal prayers strengthen our sense of community and mission and inspire our "journeying together"?
- 5. Rooted in our Baptism, are we prepared and supported and welcomed to participate in the mission of proclaiming the Gospel?
- 6. Is there a place for parish members to dialogue openly, including with those who have suffered in silence? Which persons and groups do we need to learn from?
- 7. What can we learn from other churches and believers? How well does your parish "journey together" with other communities of faith? What makes this difficult?
- 8. How does your parish identify pastoral goals, and steps to achieve them? Do you feel valued and invited to share? What steps can we take together?
- 9. How does your parish exercise discernment in decision making and prayerful listening and obedience to the Holy Spirit?
- 10. How does your parish prepare you to be a missionary disciple of Jesus Christ? As we form ourselves in synodality, where will our next steps take us?

I hope the Synodal Process and these "Listening Sessions" sound as exciting to you as they do to me. Please pray for the success of this global commitment to "communion participation and mission" and call the Parish Office if you want to join future "Listening Sessions" beginning with the ones on March 15, March 22, and March 29 at 7:00pm in the Chapel. Check the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center Synod Website for Synod updates and future "Listening Sessions" or contact me personally if you have any questions or suggestions about how to invite those no longer involved with the parish or the Church, because inclusion and listening to those of the fringes is a major goal of this "Synodal Process".

Let us all commit to becoming a Synodal, Listening Church, beginning today!

Listen, Even if You Don't Understand

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18 The covenant with Abram
- ▶ Philippians 3:17-4:1 Christ our goal
- ► Luke 9:28b-36 Jesus transfigured

As the apostles followed Jesus around the land of Galilee, they would have had plenty of ordinary moments with a seemingly average human: hiking from town to town, looking for places to camp or sleep, meeting all sorts of different people and sharing meals and wine with them, praying in synagogues on the Sabbath, etc. Then there were the incredible experiences that would have convinced them Jesus was more than an ordinary human: feeding crowds of thousands, healing the sick and crippled, speaking words of forgiveness that Jews thought only God could speak. Then, one day, three of the apostles witnessed this mysterious transfiguration of their friend on a mountaintop as two people from their history books appeared with him.

The experience was something the apostles couldn't have understood with their minds, yet they were asked by the voice from the cloud to listen to Jesus. They were asked to trust in him, to listen to him, and to follow him, even though he was such a mystery to them.

The transfiguration may not have cleared up any of the apostles' questions about Jesus' identity, but they were still asked to trust in this person who was bringing healing, freedom, and new life to so many people. It's as if



Sheepish Question:

God has kept his promise, but how am I doing with mine?

God was giving them a gift in saying "You don't have to understand how this is happening, how Jesus' clothes look whiter than white, or how two dead men are alive here. What I do want you to do is to listen to him." Only that. Don't worry about understanding with your head. Follow with your heart.
