Synod Listening Sessions Update as of 03/17/2022

These are the 3 questions we'll respond to in small groups on March 22:

Question 4: How does our parish Mass and Communal Prayer inspire and guide our "journeying together"? Do you feel engaged in our parish's liturgy and prayer life?

Question 5: How are you as a baptized person called to participate in proclaiming the Gospel? How does our parish live the mission of proclaiming the Gospel?

Question 6: Does your parish engage with other believers and with non-believers? Is there a place for parishioners to dialogue openly? How are differing opinions addressed at the parish?

If unable to attend, responses can be written by individuals and mailed to the Parish Office to be included in our parish "Listening Sessions" responses.

## From Fr. Byron

I'm pretty sure that we all know what giving up is all about.

At any point of our lives, we have given up on something: maybe a relationship; maybe trying to fix a broken thing; maybe even on people or ourselves.

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells the parable of a person who planted a fig tree but gave no fruit so he wanted to give up on it. Yet, the gardener said, "Give it another chance; I will help cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it so it may bear fruit in the future."

In this Gospel, Jesus is describing himself as the gardener and us the fig trees: even though sometimes we may give up on many things, God will never give up on us. God will never give up on us because God sees things in us, potential, room for growth and fulfillment that sometimes we don't even see in ourselves. This is indeed good news: Good News! Let this Good News remind you of your dignity, worth and potential and let's give a chance to the One who will never give up on us.


parish community bringing non-perishable foods to a 'table' honoring St. Joseph, which will be delivered to Catholic Charities. Our table will be located in the hallway.

## **Creation Care Tips**

During Lent the readings are full of desert imagery, especially the Old Testament readings which tell the story of the Israelites wandering in the desert for 40 long years, sometimes on the brink of death from lack of food and water. As Pope Benedict preached, "The external deserts in the world are growing, because the internal deserts have become so vast." Pope Francis' proposed solution for this is an interior conversion whereby our faith in Jesus is demonstrated by our relationship with the natural world. This week consider whether others can recognize in you a faith that moves you to action on behalf of the environment.

## Weekly Justice Challenge

Justice Challenge: As we enter more deeply into Lent, we recall Jesus washing the feet of his apostles. This action contains two essential challenges for those who seek justice in the world: the challenge to serve and the challenge to be served. Jesus sets the example to serve in ways that may seem to be beneath us and calls Peter to accept service. Many great leaders, even in the corporate world, spend some of their time doing the work of the lowest paid person in the organization as an important reminder that all work is valuable. This act is also a beautiful sign that the service of these all-too-often forgotten people is well-received by the leader. Step out of your comfort zone this week and do a task that may seem to be beneath you. Experience the dignity in your simple service.



## It's Not Literal


This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Exodus 17:3-7 Water from the rock
- ► Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 Faith, hope, and love
- ▶ John 4:5-42 The Samaritan woman at the well

Jesus and his people knew first hand what it was like to live in a desert locale where water was often scarce. Fetching water wasn't always a quick and easy job. It could be back-breaking and time-consuming; a never-ending chore. The matter of finding water could literally be a matter of life and death. Water was probably almost always on people's minds. It's no wonder, then, that the Samaritan woman who interprets Jesus literally when he begins talking about "living water."

It doesn't take the woman long, though, to recognize that Jesus is talking in metaphors

here. Once the discussion moves to her multiple husbands, a common metaphor used by the Old Testament prophets for religious infidelity, she realizes Jesus isn't talking about literally. (The Samaritan people had been unfaithful to Yahweh by worshiping the gods of their five successive conquestors.) Jesus is talking about Yahweh, the one true God, who is the only one who can quench human's deepest thirst. The woman then moves quickly from thinking Jesus is just a typical Jew, to a prophet, to the Messiah.


Suddenly, drawing water isn't important to her anymore and she leaves her water jug at the well to tell others about Jesus. Her action is the equivalent of what the fisherman did when they encountered Jesus - they left their fishing nets, the symbol of their livelihood, to follow him and tell others about him. The Samaritan woman at the well is just as fully an apostle as they are.
