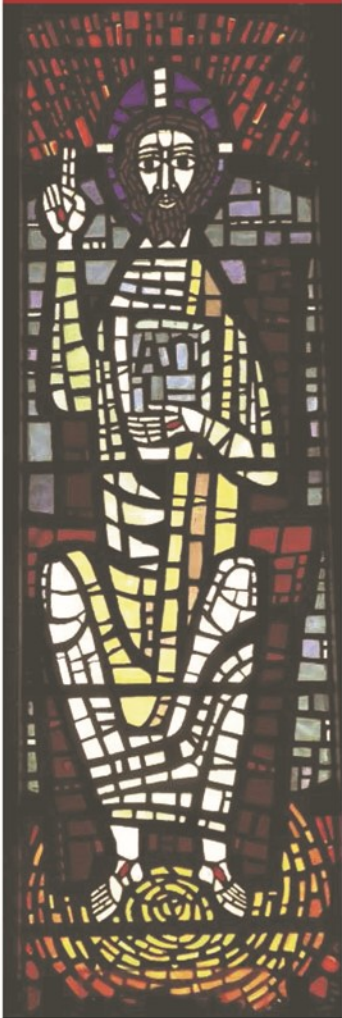

THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Jesus said, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." He was speaking to His disciples, telling them to love the other disciples. He wasn't calling them to feel affection, but to act in loving ways. We may not always be able to feel affection for another person, but we can always act kindly toward them. "Love one another." Jesus is speaking to us – telling us – commanding us – to love others and act kindly toward them. Sometimes that's easy – sometimes it isn't.

When Jesus calls us to love one another, He's calling us to love the sweet lady who brought food for the college students on Wednesday night, but He's also calling us to love the person who wounded us with their sharp tongue.

When Jesus calls us to love one another, He's calling us to love the friendly couple with whom we spoke in the Cafeteria after Mass, but He's also calling us to love the person who opposes our pet project or blocks the realization of our dream.

When Jesus calls us to love one another, He's calling us to love the musicians who grace our church with lovely music, but He's also calling us to love the person who is afflicted with a closed mind and who offers constant criticisms.

When Jesus calls us to love one another, He's calling us to love the kid who works hard, is a good student, and an altar server at Mass, but He's also calling us to love the kid who is a "D" student, is always getting into trouble, and doesn't come to church.

When Jesus calls us to love one another, He's calling us to bear witness – to show the world what He has done for us. He says, "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

"Love one another", Jesus says. It's more than a saying – it's a commandment – an order – not a suggestion! "Love one another." It's the ways we spread the presence of Jesus in the world. People can ignore almost anything we say, but they can't ignore our love.

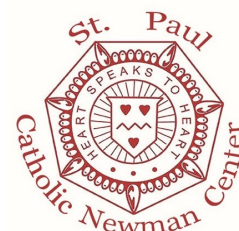
Who is Jesus calling you to love today? What is He calling you to do about it?

Sergio P. Negro Scholar Applications

Applications for Sergio P. Negro Scholarships for the 2022 - 2023 academic year are now available on the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center website. The Sergio P. Negro Endowment Fund was established in honor of our founding priest, who had a deep and abiding commitment to education. The Endowment Fund anticipates awarding a minimum of two, \$2,500 scholarships to deserving students for the academic year.

To be eligible, you must be either an upper division undergraduate or a graduate student preparing to use your knowledge and skills to witness and minister to others. This is meant to be inclusive of many vocations and forms of service, including education, medicine, social services, etc. A pre-condition is that you must have either been raised within or are currently affiliated and active with our St. Paul Catholic Newman Center parish beyond attending Mass. An overall GPA of 2.5 or greater is also required.

The deadline for applications to be received is this Sunday, May 15, 2022 at 5:00pm.

They may be submitted electronically to Scholarship@csufnewman.com or mailed to St. Paul Catholic Newman Center, 1572 E. Barstow Ave., Fresno, CA 93710. In all cases, applications and accompanying documents must be typed. Final selection of awardees will be through an interview process.

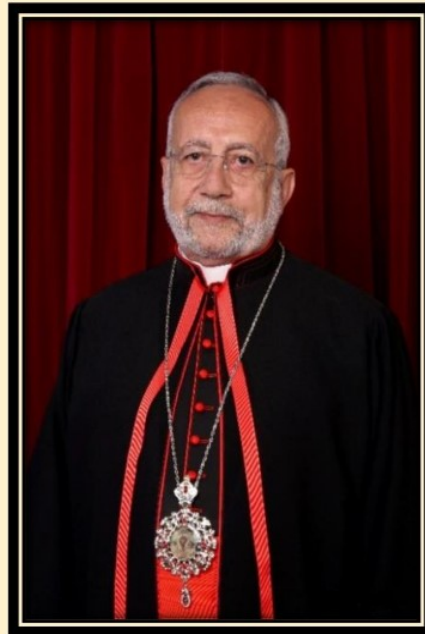

A Measure for Love

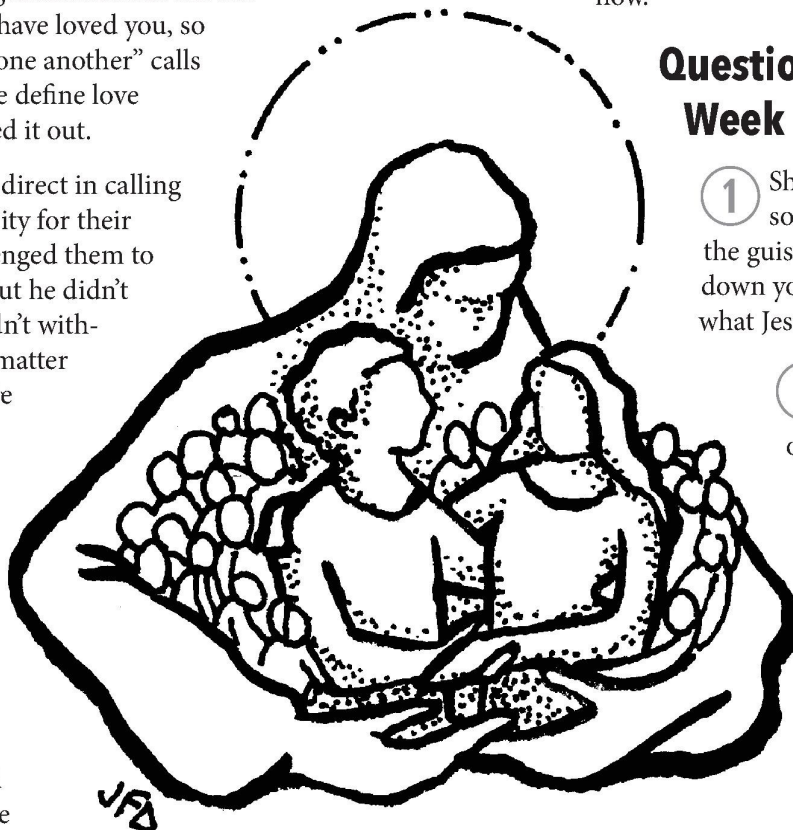
This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Acts 14:21-27 - End of the first mission
- ▶ Revelation 21:1-5a - New heavens and new earth
- ▶ John 13:31-33a, 34-35 - A new commandment

There are teachings of Jesus that seem to sum up his message perfectly. The Golden Rule—"Do unto others as you would have them do to you"—is one example. Another appears in the Gospel passage from John today. "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (Jn. 13:34).

If Jesus had left this new commandment at "love one another," it would have been open to more interpretation. What one person might consider love ("I beat my child to teach him a lesson because I love him") would be offensive to another person's understanding of love. If we think only in terms of "love one another" we might be tempted to reduce it to something like "Do no harm." That could let us off the hook for not being proactive to help others, as long as we aren't actively making someone's life harder. Adding the line "as I have loved you, so you also should love one another" calls us to measure how we define love against how Jesus lived it out.

Jesus was honest and direct in calling people to accountability for their actions, and he challenged them to stretch to be better. But he didn't shame people. He didn't withhold forgiveness, no matter what the sins were. He always moved to bring people back into the community rather than condemning them to be outcasts. He stood up for those being cheated or exploited by the wealthy and powerful. He reached out to the sick and the

lame, offering his healing presence no matter how grotesque their illness or disfigurement was. Let us then love one another as Jesus showed us how.
