

Readings: Acts 13:14, 43-52; Rev 7:9, 14b-17; Jn 10:27-30

Vatican II, Pope Francis, and the Synod on Synodality: how I see them intimately related

As I'm hoping you already know by now, Pope Francis has invited the whole Roman Catholic Church to answer 10 questions in preparation for the upcoming Synod on Synodality, which will convene in October, 2023.

St. Paul Catholic Newman Center has publicized this unprecedented effort of our Church to revive the Spirit of Vatican II. It was summarized so profoundly in the opening lines of the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World. "The Joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties of the people of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ".

What does this prophetic promise from the Second Vatican Council, issued by 2300 Bishops back in 1965 have to do with Pope Francis' historic survey of the Church today, so different in so many ways from the Church many of us grew up in 60 years ago? What does what happened in Rome from 1962 through 1965 have to do with Pope Francis' dream of a "missionary option, that is a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today's world rather than for her self-preservation". (The Joy of the Gospel, #27, November 24, 2013)

Everything! I see everything in Pope Francis' prophetic and pastoral papacy as a concerted effort to answer the challenge which the Council proposed for the Church- to adopt a way of being and thinking and praying and relating that responds to the needs of the modern world- and not "self-preservation" as the Council, and the Pontiff have repeatedly warned us against.

Examples? I think the 10 questions proposed by the Vatican are brilliant and are giving Catholics all over the world a chance to honestly share their "joys and hopes, griefs and anxieties" with their small local communities even before having them somehow compiled in a summary statement to Rome. I've been part of "Listening Sessions" at the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center in Fresno, and have been inspired and challenged by what brother and sister parishioners have shared about all the questions proposed for community reflection: journeying, and not journeying, together (Question #1), listening to, but also excluding others (Question #2), being able to speak out, but also wondering who's listening (Question #3), celebrating (Question #4), Co-responsibility in Mission (#5), Dialogue in Church and Society and need for more outreach with those who feel silenced, and with other believers and non-believers (#6), With other Christian Denominations (#7), Authority and Participation- need for more parish shared leadership (parish council) (#8), Discerning and Deciding-listening to the Holy Spirit (#9), Forming Ourselves in Synodality- Journeying Together as a new experience for many (#10)

According to the Synod of Bishops website (www.synod.va) "the purpose of the Synod, and therefore of this consultation, is not to produce documents, but to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands"

I have already seen seeds of this reality in listening sessions I've attended and in the notes which I am compiling for the parish and summarizing for the Diocese. I look forward to the Newman Center developing a renewed commitment to its vision and mission based on the "joys and hopes, griefs and anxieties" which have been shared so personally and profoundly in these listening sessions which we have participated in over the past three months.

## Sergio P. Negro Scholar Applications

Applications for Sergio P. Negro Scholarships for the 2022 - 2023 academic year are now available on the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center website. The Sergio P. # We Can Know His Voice

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Acts 13:14, 43-52 Paul's and Barnabas' address to the gentiles

- ▶ John 10:27-30 The Good Shepherd


Today's Gospel reading emphasizes that Jesus is the ultimate good shepherd. "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me." We might wonder how we can recognize Jesus' voice as humans living in the 21st century, not sheep following a shepherd in the first century. It begins by trusting that the shepherd wants what is best for the sheep. Do we believe that God wants what is best for us? Because he does.

Jesus also said, "I have come that they may have life in abundance." God wants us to have joy, freedom, fulfillment, and love, not deprivation, emptiness, and loneliness. If we have internalized the latter message, we have been tricked into following a shepherd who is not interested in our care and protection. In that case, the first step is to ask God for a greater trust that he wants us to have life in its fullness, here and now, not just after we die.

When we believe that Jesus loves us enough to have our very best interests at heart, we can practice listening for invitations that bring us more energy, excitement, joy, and peace. Maybe a new job offer is particularly invigorating—that is probably Jesus' voice calling us to follow.

Perhaps an invitation from a friend or acquaintance leads us to a sense of greater joy or contentment than what we are currently spending our time on. That could be the voice of Jesus calling us to follow.

Maybe an activity or relationship we are engaged in

is contributing to depression, anxiety, self-hatred, or substance abuse. In that case, the thought of ending that activity or relationship may give us a glimpse of freedom and relief. If that is the case, perhaps it is the voice of Jesus calling us to leave that behind us. There are many ways Jesus can call to us. If we listen for and follow the invitations that lead to greater life, then we can trust we are following Jesus' voice.
