



Your challenge this week is to search your heart and ask yourself, "Do I work for justice as well as care for those in need?" Then choose one act of justice—emailing your legislators about a vote coming up in Congress on aid to the poor, calling the White House to let the President know your opinion on a justice issue, researching the just (or unjust) practices of a company from which you purchase goods and then choosing how much you can or cannot support that company—and follow in Dorothy Day's footsteps. Do something for those who have nothing to give you in return.

From Bishop Brennan

Pope Francis has encouraged the whole Church to participate in a Listening and Discernment process in preparation for the Synod of Bishops to take place in Rome in October of 2023. This preparation is an essential and integral element for the upcoming Synod entitled, Communion, Participation, and Mission. Think of it as a world-wide Listening Session, which is fact, it is intended to be. Literally every diocese in the world and every parish in every diocese will be invited to take part and give some input. This diocesan phase will conclude in April of 2022 at which time every diocese in the world will forward to Rome a very concise summary of its findings which will determine the contact and direction of the Synod. In fact, the aim of all is to help the Church and everyone in it to live, evangelize and operate in a synodal way. We will all be learning more about what that means in weeks to come. I have put together a Synod Committee which will guide us all through this process over the coming months. You will be receiving much more material and information through them.


Take the Long View

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Daniel 7:13-14 Daniel's vision of one like the Son of man
- ► Revelation 1:5-8 Praise to Jesus Christ
- ▶ John 18:33b-37 The blood and water

On the last Sunday of the church year, just before we begin Advent, we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. The readings remind us that there is purpose in our lives that moves in the direction of God's Kingdom, despite the disturbing reality of hatred, violence, natural disasters, illness, and death. Martin Luther King Jr. put it this way: "The arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends toward justice."

This feast reminds us to look beyond the tragedy and suffering of our lives with the hope that there is more to life than the eye can see. Jesus points to this in his exchange with Pontius Pilate when Pilate puts him on trial before sentencing him to death. The chief priests handed Jesus over, accusing him of claiming to be the King of the Jews and a threat to the ruling Roman empire. Jesus won't deny that he is a king, but he responds that his kingdom "does not belong to this world."

Sheepish Question:

Why are my questions important to such a vast God?

As Christians, the point isn't that we should passively endure violence, torture, and suffering in this life just because we are waiting for the next life. In fact, Jesus did everything he could to relieve the physical, emotional, and mental pain of those he met during his lifetime. The point is, as humans we cannot escape some pain because we live in an imperfect world. But while we must suffer, we can also hold out hope for a kingdom we can't yet see where Christ is our leader and Christ will rule over a realm of truth, peace, and love.

Is the afterlife something you think about? Why or why not? How do you think of it?

Have you experienced any periods in your life when the Christian concept of another kingdom awaiting you was comforting? How so?
