Dear Brothers and Sisters,

While for many this weekend marks the beginning of the collegiate Football Season, with the NFL following next week, there is another Season we begin this week which is much more important.

It's called the Season of Creation, and beginning in 2015, it is a worldwide effort of over 2 billion Christians to join in prayer and action in our faith-based commitment to care for Mother Earth, or as Pope Francis calls it, our Common Home.

Originally this annual Day of Prayer for Creation began with Ecumenical Patriarch Demetrios of Constantinople way back in 1989. His initiative was continued and expanded by his successor Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, whom Pope Francis highlights in #8 and 9 of his encyclical "Laudato St: On Care for Our Common Home" (2015) <u>https://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/encyclicals/documents/papa-francesco_20150524_enciclica-laudato-si.html</u>

Over the years, Francis and Bartholomew have become not just friends, but brothers, and together they have co-signed ecological statements and ecumenical commitments with many major churches to not just pray for but work together to care for God's creation at this critical time in the earth's history.

This "Day of Creation" is now a global Season of Creation which begins on September 1 and extends through October 4, the Feast of St. Francis. This year's theme is "Listening to the voice of creation", which Pope Francis describes passionately in this year's "World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation". <u>https://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/messages/pont-messages/2022/documents/20220716-messaggio-giornata-curacreato.html</u>

Here are some of the ways that St. Paul Catholic Newman Center community will celebrate the Season of Creation this year:

- 1. We will launch the Season of Creation at all weekend Masses on September 3-4.
- 2. Thanks to liturgical artist Donna Locati and Parish Life Coordinator Linda Ram, a beautiful "Burning Bush" will be displayed in the sanctuary of the altar. This powerful liturgical symbol will remind us all Season long of our need to "Listen to the Voice of Creation" just as Moses learns in Exodus 3:1-12) that God, speaking from a burning bush, had "witnessed the affliction and heard the cry of His people" and promised to come down and rescue them and lead them to a "good and spacious land, flowing with milk and honey".

3. This same liberating God still cares for every single part of Creation, but we have a part to play as well. As Laudato Si reminds us "ecological crisis is also a summons to profound interior conversion...an ecological conversion whereby the effects of their encounter with Jesus Christ become evident in their relationship with the world around them. Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional aspect of our Christian experience" (# 217)... Today we must realize that a true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor" (Laudato Si, # 49)

4. We'll try to start this "ecological conversion" in several ways. At all liturgies during September, we will have special prayers, intercessions and music that remind us of the work we have before us.

5. On our Creation Care webpage, we will be sharing resources for personal, family and parish-based ways to start to prolong the Season of Creation by acting on proposals readily available to all of us on www.laudatosiactionplatform.com.

6. On most Tuesday evenings from September 20 through November 29 we will offer elective sessions during "Faith, Family & Friends" which will focus on Care for Creation and other social justice issues focusing on "the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor".

7. On October 3, we will resume our "Creation Care Team" meetings by Zoom and make a greater effort to "listen and act on" the input from participants about their priorities around "Creation Care", including follow up on a St. Paul Catholic Newman Center Community Garden and composting which were favorites last year.

8. On October 4 we will have an Intergenerational evening celebration of Catholic Traditions and Rituals concluding with reflections on St. Francis and Care for Creation.

9. Details on all these efforts will be found in future parish bulletins and on the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center website. Just go there, click on "Ministries" and then "Peace and Social Justice" for weekly updates on the six major Social Justice issues which we will be developing this year:

- A. Environmental Justice (Creation Care)
- B. Racial Equity and Social Justice
- C. Restorative Justice
- D. Health Care
- E. Care for the Poor
- F. Anti-Violence Commitments

The Book of Wisdom reminds us explicitly that we can't imagine or understand what the Lord intends for us and our world. Paul writes to Philemon of how he wishes he could keep his dear friend Onesimus with him, yet Paul feels compelled to send him back for a higher purpose which he can't fully understand yet. Jesus then tells the crowds that what they thought was the ideal in love is not the ideal at all. All are reminders that we can never fully understand the vision God has for us as individuals or as a whole. We are called to keep listening and responding as God invites us to, even when we don't know why God is leading us in such a direction.

As today's Gospel reading opens, Jesus is on the road to Jerusalem, which was code language for the people of his day, meaning "trouble." Jews of the time recognized Jerusalem as the place where prophets met their doom, finally killed by the unjust powers they challenged. Jesus knew he was on the road to a confrontation with the authorities that would ultimately cost him his life. With "great crowds" following him, he pauses to make it clear that if they choose to continue following him, they must be prepared to say goodbye to the life they know.

Jesus tells them they must be willing to leave behind their families, their possessions, and all that they know if they want to follow him. There is no "half-following Jesus" or "half-discipleship." He gives them a choice. You either follow fully, being will-



ing to leave everything behind, or you don't follow, he seems to say. Such words may seem harsh, but Jesus refuses to sugar-coat his calling. Those following Jesus have presumably already experienced joy, new life, community, grace, and healing as they've walked with him. Now he wants to make sure they know they are also heading down a dangerous road and they should choose him with eyes wide open. It is a challenge that almost surely stopped some people up, and made them decide to go back to their former, safe ways of living.

Questions of the Week

Think of people you know or have heard or read about who continued to travel the road of discipleship even as the cost to themselves became more evident. What do they have to teach you?

What do you need to renounce to follow Jesus more faithfully?
