RECOGNIZING THE STRANGER

"And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight."

(Luke 24:30-31)

In this beautiful encounter on the road to Emmaus, the disciples recognize Christ in the breaking of the bread. Despite having spent all day speaking with him along the road, it was in this action – the sharing of the essentials of life – that Christ became present to them. And with this physical and spiritual nourishment, the disciples overcome their fear and return to Jerusalem to continue in their mission.

On February 3rd and 4th, the Newman Center will have a training titled "Recognizing the Stranger." This is part of a national series of trainings organized in over 20 Dioceses by the West/Southwest Industrial Areas Foundation (IAF). Thousands of leaders have been trained in how to live out the teachings of the Gospel in their communities. The trainings have been so impactful that leaders, priests and organizers from the IAF were invited to meet with Pope Francis in October to share more. Our local organizer, Tim McManus, was part of the delegation and was able to tell Pope Francis about the work in the Central Valley.

Centered in Catholic teaching and scripture, the trainings help parishioners reflect on the mission of the Church, our Baptismal commitments, and the social nature of the Eucharist. Participants learn concrete skills to help their parish better engage the community and work to tackle the biggest challenges facing Valley families. Bishop Joseph Brennan will open our training on Friday evening with a reflection and conclude on Saturday with Mass.

Pope Francis has called for a Church that goes out to the margins of our community

If you want to help the Newman Center deepen its efforts to address community concerns, this training is for you. This is an opportunity for existing parish leaders, or for those of you who hear this as a calling for where you might lead. We especially hope our young adult parishioners consider the training Pope Francis has called for a Church that goes out to the margins of our community, and we will especially need you to lead the Church into that future.

When the IAF met with Pope Francis in October, he stressed the importance of *amor concreto*, "concrete love." He shared that the Gospel message is all about loving real people in real situations with real concerns. The Recognizing the Stranger trainings are designed to develop a team of leaders capable of doing this and sustaining it over time. We hope you will consider joining the team from the Newman Center that will participate.

The training begins at 6:00pm on Friday, February 3rd in the Cardinal Newman Hall, with a meal served beforehand. It will continue on Saturday, February 4th at 9:00am, concluding with a 3:30pm Mass with Bishop Brennan. To register, go to https://dioceseoffresno.org/recognizing-the-stranger, or our website. FR. BYRON MACIAS, CMF

When I was young, I used to think that Jesus was a Sunday event, a sacred parenthesis that lasted an hour on Sundays. It was an abstract relationship with a rather nebulous man.

It wasn't until I read the Gospels that I began to really know Him. They actually made me encounter this joyful, hopeful, vibrant, Divine, assertive Man-God, whose mission was driven by his perfect love for us. They made me understand the Incarnation and why Jesus fully embraced our humanity. I converted at that moment, to the point of wanting to give all I have and all I am to Him.

"I did not know him" says John the Baptist of Jesus (and he says it twice (John 1:29-34)). Yet, the Spirit inspires him to really know him. John the Baptist had to really know Jesus and once he fully knew Him, he realized that He was the Son of God.

I beg you to get to know Jesus: what He did, what He said, how He dealt with joys and sorrows... why He died on the cross.

Once we know somebody, it is impossible to forget them. Let's ask the Holy Spirit to grant us the audacity to get to really know the One who knows us fully, accepts us for who we are and will never forget us.
